#### Food waste and sustainability session - All years

#### Uniform standards - Polite reminder to pupils and parents

A Parklands blazer must be worn at all times.

Only a plain navy blue jumper or cardigan may be worn under a blazer.

Hoodies and Coats are not allowed to be worn in the school building.

Black school shoes must be worn and trainers are not allowed.

Pupils must wear the correct colour tie for their year group. Ties are available on SCOPAY should your child lose theirs. They are priced at £8 and can be collected from the School Office.

Jewelry/make up/lashes are not allowed and pupils will be required to remove them.

Any pupil who arrives at school wearing the incorrect uniform will be loaned items from our pre-loved collection. Pupils must hand over their phone to secure a loaned item.

We do have a large collection of good quality pre-loved uniform. #### School office procedures

Please could we ask that the office is only contacted with messages for pupils in an emergency. In addition to this, the office will only contact home for pupils in *exceptional* circumstances. Due to the high volume of incoming and outgoing calls it is not possible for non-urgent messages to be relayed as this could delay a message relating to an emergency. Pupils can pick up text messages once they leave the school grounds after 3pm and switch their mobile phones on.

Please remind your child to inform you in advance of any information relating to their after school commitments/arrangements such as after school clubs. We cannot routinely pass on messages of this nature.

### Dropping items off at school

Any items that are dropped off for pupils at Reception will be left there for pupils to collect. **Year 7 Netball Tournament -** This was postponed due to poor weather. We will contact you with another date as soon as it has been rescheduled.






