Headteacher's Message

Dear parents, carers and students,

We've reached the end of what seems to have been a very long half-term. Getting back to normal clearly makes us all feel very tired!

A couple of weeks ago I held a whole-school assembly, in which I spoke about the reasons why I believe Parklands is the best school in Chorley. Chorley is lucky to have so many good schools, but our holistic approach to education sets us apart and results in exceptionally well-rounded young people. Our reputation remains strong, evidenced in the huge number of appeals we have for places at Parklands for this coming September. We continue to be over-subscribed, but rather than rest on our laurels, we are continually seeking ways to improve our provision.

Clearly, none of this can be achieved without the support of parents and carers. It is the home-school partnership which is so fundamental to a school's success, and I thank you for your feedback in the recent parental surveys and your ongoing support.

Updated Behaviour Policy

Our new Behaviour Policy is available on our website under School Information/Policies. In light of the national issues around knife crime and anti-social behaviour, the governing body and I have strengthened our stance on behaviour. This also ties in with the Government's new White Paper (specifically paragraphs 71 - 73).

It is important that all parents, carers and students are aware of our zero-tolerance approach to drugs and prohibited items (see sections 4 and 6 of our Behaviour Policy) so that we can continue to keep our school community safe.

I hope you all have a lovely, relaxing Easter break, and **Ramadan Mubarak** to members of our school community who observe this religious festival.

Updated COVID guidance from the DfE

Changes to measures and guidance for managing COVID-19 in education and childcare settings from Friday 1 April

On Tuesday 29 March, the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care, Sajid Javid, set out the <u>next steps for living with COVID-19</u> in England from Friday 1 April.

Free COVID-19 tests will continue to be available for specific groups, including eligible patients and NHS staff, once the universal testing offer ends on Friday 1 April. Updated guidance will advise:

- adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature
- children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend
- adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days

The population now has much stronger protection against COVID-19 than at any other point in the pandemic. This means we can begin to manage the virus like other respiratory infections, thanks to the success of the vaccination programme and access to antivirals, alongside natural immunity and increased scientific and public understanding about how to manage risk.

For education and childcare settings from Friday 1 April:

- regular asymptomatic testing is no longer recommended in any education or childcare setting, including in SEND, alternative provision and children's social care settings. Therefore, settings will no longer be able to order test kits
- the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) will publish new guidance. Most of the specific COVID-19 guidance for education and childcare settings will be withdrawn from GOV.UK on Friday 1 April. The operational guidance on the <u>testing in education</u> <u>settings document sharing platform</u> will also be removed on the same day
