- Parklands High School continues to be a good school.
- Pupils feel safe and cared for as part of this welcoming and friendly school.
- Overall, pupils enjoy attending Parklands High School. They are happy.
- Leaders have high expectations for all pupils, including those with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND). Pupils have positive attitudes towards their learning. They work hard and they achieve highly.
- Pupils know that leaders expect them to behave well. Pupils respond to leaders' high expectations by being polite and courteous. The atmosphere in school is calm and purposeful. Pupils spoke positively about how they learn to treat everyone equally and with respect.
- Leaders have prioritised the development of the curriculum with care and precision. They have designed a broad and ambitious curriculum for all pupils, including those pupils with SEND.
- Leaders prioritise reading. This encourages a love of reading. Pupils said that they enjoy these sessions.
- Pastoral support is strong.
- Pupils manage their own behaviour well, both in lessons and during breaktimes. They are respectful of their teachers. Learning is rarely disrupted by poor behaviour.
- Pupils experience a strong careers programme.
- Staff enjoy working at this school.
- Trustees, governors and leaders know the school well. During this time of transition into a multi-academy trust, they have worked closely together to ensure that they can continue to provide a high-quality education for all pupils.
