## **Headteacher's Message**

Dear parents and carers,

We have reached the end of another very busy half term at Parklands. Year 11 are now very much on the final countdown before their exams. Next week is our annual Easter School, where the children can get some final revision tips before the start of the exams. Hopefully all of our Year 11s will use the Easter Break to make sure they are ready and prepared for the start of the exam season next half term.

School reopens for the Summer term on Tuesday 22nd April for all pupils. The French Speaking Exams take place on Wednesday 23rd, and this is the first of the exam sessions. There is also a Parents and Carers Evening on Wednesday for those going on the Barcelona Trip next year. On Thursday 24th April we will be holding our final Progress Evening for Year 11; this will be online and appointments will be available to book the week before on School Cloud as usual.

In the second week back, the main GCSE exam season begins, with Art and Photography both taking place this week. There are further exams the following week, with the first whole cohort exam being English Literature Paper 1 on Monday 12th May. Year 11 pupils all have their exam timetables and these are also available on Edulink.

From May 1st, the food prices in the canteen will be increasing. We appreciate that this is not great news, but I'm sure that you recognise that costs are increasing across the country of all items, including energy, ingredients, and staff. Currently, our prices are below those in other schools in the local area, and have not increased for a number of years. We will keep the increase minimal, and we are intending to raise prices incrementally across the Summer term to try to reduce the impact on family budgets. The school canteen is run on a not for profit basis, and this increase is purely to cover our increasing costs whilst maintaining the quality and range of our provision. If you feel that you may be entitled to, but are not in receipt of, free school meals, please click on this link to check if you may be eligible to claim. If you find you are eligible for free school meals, please let school know once this has been confirmed.

Finally, I'd like to wish you all a fabulous break. We look forward to seeing everyone back on Tuesday 22nd.

**Extra Challenge:** students in Years 8 and 9 are encouraged to test their knowledge by answering questions from the earlier year groups!


## **Chorley Tennis Club**



## What Parents & Educators Need to Know about-

GE RESTRICTION

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WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

Now

Instagram remains one of the world's most popular social media platforms, especially among teens – with around 70% of 13 to 17-year-olds using it. Owned by Meta, Instagram allows users to share photos and videos, create interactive 'stories', broadcast live, send private messages and follow others. With regular updates and new features, it's essential for parents and educators to stay informed about how children are using the app - and what the risks are.

## **EXCESSIVE SCREEN**

instagram's design encourages prolonged use through endless scrolling of trending content and generating a fear of missing out (FOMO). Children can quickly lose track of time browsing posts from friends, influencers, and strangers, which may disrupt their day-to-day activities.

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### AI CHATBOT CONCERNS

Meta's Al, which is available on instagram, allows users to chat with an in-app chatbot. While often helpful, it can blur boundaries for young users, who may ask for or read content that is inappropriate or seel tas a real friend or confidant. Privacy issues also arise, as conversations may not be as secure or private as children assume.

## RISKS OF GOING LIVE

The livestream feature allows real-time broadcasting to followers – or anyone, if the account is public. This increases the chance of unwanted contact from strongers and pressure to act in ways that gain attention, including engaging in inappropriate behaviour. Viewers may also post offensive or harmful comments during live sessions.

## THREADS INTEGRATION

Threads is instagram's sister app for public, text-based conversations. Posts from Threads appear in user' instagram feeds and can lead children to view, share, and comment on public conversations with strangers. The content may not always be age-appropriate and can be misleading or false.

### **SCHEDULED** MESSAGING

instagram's newer ability to schedule direct messages means that children could receive messages late at night or early in the morning. This can disrupt their sleep or keep them preoccupied before the school day even begins.

## **EXCLUSION AND LOW**

reeing ier out online can have a real emotions impact. Being left out of photos, receiving fewer likes, being unfollowed, or being ignored in chats and comments can leave children feeling excluded, which often hurts as much as in real life. There is a risk this can lead to reduced deff-esteem and a sense of not belonging.

## **USE INSTAGRAM'S SUPERVISION TOOLS**

## OPEN UP THE CONVERSATION

Instagram – and what makes them uncomfortable. Encourage honest chats about filters, body image, and online approval. Reassure them that they don't need to edit their appearance or chase "likes" to feel valuet.

## SET BOUNDARIES FOR THREADS AND AI

Parental controls on instagram also apply to Threads. These allow parents to monitor time spent in the app, check follower lists and adjust exposure to sensitive content. Discuss Al features, too, therefore helping children understand that chatbots aren't real people and should be used with care.

## BE MEDIA-SAVVY WITH INFLUENCERS

Parents should follow a few of the influencers their child watches, so the better understand the content they're seeing. Use this as a springboard about the difference between genuine recommendations and paid pro the watchestiffs can shape opinions and behaviour.



## Qualifications

You may need basic literacy and numeracy skills (usually grade 4/C at GCSE) in English and maths as a minimum. We will provide you with ongoing training and development.

## Working hours

Teaching Assistants work during the school day, usually from 8.30am to 3pm (this may vary by school).

## Salary

Salaries are dependent on hours worked, experience and skills. For example, working 37 hours per week during term time you could earn at least £1,741 gross per month. Part-time hours may also be available.


