### Headteacher's Message

Dear parents and carers,

It has been lovely to see all of our pupils back in school this week and ready to start the new academic year. We are looking forward to a successful and enjoyable year ahead.

I have held assemblies this week with all year groups to clarify our standards and expectations. I reminded pupils about the importance of high standards of uniform, including a reminder that make up, false nails, and false eyelashes are not allowed in school. I also spoke about the importance of good attendance, punctuality, and Behaviour for Learning. The assemblies also included information about more serious matters of the consequences of repeated poor behaviour, bringing prohibited items into school, and also of becoming involved in anti-social behaviour outside of school. All of these are examples of behaviour which could lead to permanent exclusion from Parklands. Though we start the year with this reminder, we know that the vast majority of Parklands pupils behave well both in and out of school, and are a credit to us all.

Pupils have also been reminded of our expectations around mobile phones in school. All mobile phones and ear buds should be **off and out of sight** on our school premises. We spoke to the pupils at some length last year about the reasons beyond this expectation, and we have been really pleased with how the pupils have responded to this.

I would also like to remind you that all pupils should have a refillable water bottle with them every day in school. We have several water fountains which dispense cold drinking water, and these can be used by pupils to fill their bottles during the day. We have also ordered some reusable water bottles with Parklands branding and these will soon be available for pupils to buy at a reduced cost from school, using cash or Scopay.

An additional reminder that Parklands offers a wide range of extra curricular activities for our pupils to get involved in; please encourage them to check the timetable for clubs in school and to get themselves involved in as many as possible.

To end on a positive note, we were delighted with our outgoing Year 11's GCSE results. This was our strongest performance ever and we are proud of them all. We know that pupils achieve their very best with us at Parklands, as a result of our high expectations, our pastoral care, and your support.

### **School office**

Please could we ask that the office is only contacted with messages for pupils in an emergency as per the Mobile Phone and Smartwatch responsible use policy. In addition to this, the office will only contact home in *exceptional* circumstances. Due to the high volume of incoming and outgoing calls it is not possible for non-urgent messages to be relayed as this could delay a message relating to an emergency. You are welcome to send texts to pupils as they will be able to switch their mobile phones on and check for messages once they leave the school grounds after 3pm.

#### After school arrangements

Please remind your child to inform you in advance of any information relating to their after school commitments/arrangements such as after school clubs. We cannot routinely pass on messages of this nature.

### Dropping items off at school

Any items that are dropped off for pupils at Reception will be left there for pupils to collect. Due to the volume of items we receive each day, we cannot deliver items to pupils or send messages letting them know they have arrived. Therefore please ensure your child is aware that in the event they forget something they know to check at the main office. Messages will only be sent relating to medication. For anything that is being left with us please ensure your child's full name is on and clearly visible.



### WHAT IS CLASSCHARTS?

At Parklands, we use Classcharts to record positive praise, rewards, badges achieved, skills displayed as well as logging infringements to the school standards.

All parents are able to access this through the **ClassCharts Parent App** or through the **ClassCharts** website.

This will allow you to track their positive behaviour points, their timetable, any milestones e.g "Bronze Award" as well as the ever coveted "Pupil of the Week" award.

### HOW TO ACCESS CLASSCHARTS

You will be able to access the parent account by using this spreadsheet to find your **parent access code**.

To protect data, you will have to use your child's **Admission number** to identify the correct Parent Access Code. If you are already logged in to ClassCharts from a previous year you do not need to take any further action.


