## Principal's Message

Dear Parents & Carers,

This week has been the first week of the new mobile phone policy, and we are really pleased with how well this has worked. Our new glass shelter (named the Pacific Hub by pupil nomination) now has tables and benches; the shelter has been really well used this week with pupils sitting with their friends and even playing a few card games. 
The Year 9 students selected and prepared engaging lessons on various topics, including:

A great week in the PE department. The summer season is well and truly underway with cricket, rounders, athletics and tennis on display! Check out the new extra curricular timetable.


