Headteacher's Message

Dear parents, carers and students,

Consultation on forming a Multi-Academy Trust

The consultation closed on Monday, 31 October. The Chair of Governors welcomed the comments received and has discussed them with me at length. Having considered all responses and feedback, the Governing Body has decided to proceed with the formation of a Multi-Academy Trust with both Balshaw Lane Primary School and Highfield Community Primary School. The chosen name of the MAT will be **Aspirational Futures Multi-Academy Trust**. The proposed opening date of the MAT is January 2023, with the two primaries joining us around Easter, as they have to go through the lengthy conversion process to become academies before being able to officially join us. For parents, carers and students of Parklands, you will not notice any changes initially. I will remain as Headteacher, Parklands will remain as Parklands, uniform will remain the same, our standards and expectations will remain the same, so it will be business as usual.

Standards

Each day this week I have held an assembly with every year group in order to remind our students of the standards we have here at Parklands. Timely reminders are always a good thing in order reaffirm our expectations. Whilst the overwhelming majority of our students consistently live up to our school motto of LEARN, RESPECT, ASPIRE, ACHIEVE, we have noticed a rise recently in the usage of offensive language amongst our youngest pupils in years 7 & 8. When dealing with such incidents, it is often the case that the pupils claim to not understand the language they are using or how offensive it can be. I would strongly urge all parents/carers, especially of pupils in Key Stage 3, to please discuss this with their child. We do not accept or tolerate racist, homophobic, sexist or any language which is used to offend others. I am exceptionally proud of our bright, vibrant and tolerant school community, and it is our role as adults to educate when pupils gets things wrong. However, please rest assured that our full range of sanctions (as listed in our Behaviour Policy) are applied when incidents are reported to us.

Having focused on our standards, I then showed the students the huge amount of praise about them, which teaching staff had emailed me before half-term. It was fantastic to see student faces lighting up when they or their class got a mention from a teacher. This was a great reminder that the vast majority of our students live up to our expectations each and every day.




If you have any boots/trainers/shin pads in great condition that no longer fit your child or you, then please donate them to our PE department.




