



Support for Ukraine

Charity News! We will support the charities mentioned below during this crisis.



Sunflower of Peace is a charity that helps paramedics and doctors, and has been fundraising for supplies, which includes first aid medical tactical backpacks.

United Help Ukraine focuses on providing medical supplies and humanitarian aid, and raising awareness of the conflict.

Voices of Children aims to help children affected by the war in eastern Ukraine, providing support through art therapy, psychologists, video storytelling and a number of other methods.

The British Red Cross has launched an emergency appeal to help Ukraine. The charity will be updating its webpage with news on the work its team is doing, and how support will be used to help people.

This week we have been collecting for Chorley Food Bank as they have been running low on supplies and we have started collecting items and raising funds for The Chorley and District Support for the Ukraine group. The group is collecting baby food, nappies, wet wipes, powdered milk, feminine hygiene products, shampoo and conditioner, blankets, first aid items, waterproof coats and blankets which are to be sent to Ukrainian refugees in Poland.

Donations can be dropped off at St Laurence Church, Chorley Tues-Fri 11-1 Sat 1-4 or Sunday 12-3 and there is also a donation trolley in Morrisons Supermarket Chorley. International Aid Warehouse based at Lostock Hall also urgently needs volunteers to help sort and box up the donations They are open 9.30am-5pm Tel: 01772 619888

Conflict in Ukraine and Its Impact on Children and Young People

This may be a worrying time for many pupils in your school, but will be an especially worrying time for Russian and Ukrainian nationality or heritage pupils. These pupils may have family or other links to Ukraine or Russia and may face racism and prejudice from other community members due to their nationality or heritage. On the other hand, these pupils may prefer not to speak about these issues at school (particularly if it not arising with others) and may appreciate the routine and stability of school as a place of safety. Additionally, there may be tensions between other groups of pupils in schools, particularly those whose heritage is from countries near to Ukraine.

Children and young people will be accessing information about the conflict from sources of varying degrees of reliability. The British Psychological Society have advice and guidance on how to best support children and young people who are anxious about war and conflict:
