Update to Parklands stakeholders 30th November 2023

Dear parents, carers and students,

I am delighted to be able to give you an update following the formation of our trust - Aspirational Futures. As I am quickly learning, the process of onboarding new schools into our trust is a very lengthy process due to the amount of legal work which must be completed. However, we are hopefully still on track to be a trust of 5 schools by Easter 2024.

Highfield Primary School and Balshaw Lane Primary School

These are, with Parklands, the founding schools of our trust, and I have been having regular meetings with the headteachers, Mr Proctor from Highfield and Mrs Gregson from Balshaw Lane to discuss our plans regarding collaboration. We had anticipated that both these schools would have converted to academies and joined our trust by November, but we are hopeful that, following a meeting with the Department for Education and the Local Authority earlier this week, conversion will take place on 1st February 2024.

Walton le Dale High School

Many of you will remember Mrs Ardern, who worked with me for many years at Parklands. Since Easter 2023 Mrs Ardern has been the Acting Headteacher at Walton le Dale, working with her new team, myself and several other colleagues from Parklands on plans for their school improvement. This is a very exciting time for the school and our trust, and we look forward to welcoming the Walton le Dale school community into the Aspirational Futures family around February next year as well.

Gillibrand Primary School

This is the 5th school to join our family of schools, with conversion due to take place on 1st March 2024. Unfortunately, the headteacher Mrs Clayton is currently unwell and is therefore unable to fulfil her own personal ambition of the school joining the trust, but we are committed to ensuring that her dream does not fail, so we have been working with the Acting Headteacher, Mrs Clark, and the Chair of Governors, on the process of academisation and joining us.

As Chief Executive of the trust, I am gradually getting used to my new role. I enjoyed over 12 years working at Parklands, with 5 years as headteacher, but I have finally come to terms with handing the reins over to Mrs Batson who took up the post of Principal earlier this year. I continue to be constantly amazed, delighted and inspired by the students and staff at Parklands, and my regular meetings with Mrs Batson give me peace of mind and security in the knowledge that the school continues to do all it can in the best interests of the pupils and the Parklands community. Despite a successful Ofsted inspection and another year of great GCSE results, it is clear that everyone in the school is keen to do all they can to ensure the school continues to thrive, to develop the pupils into wonderful young adults, and provide a high quality, inclusive education. There is certainly no sense of resting on one's laurels!

GCSE Presentation Evening took place last week, and while it was a joyous occasion, seeing our former year 11s and celebrating their successes with them, it was also a sad occasion for me

personally, as this was my final cohort of year 11 students. When they joined Parklands in September 2018, little did we all know that a global pandemic was about to hit us! The tumultuous journey we all went through ultimately led to a great set of exam results, and I am so proud that our school community - our Parklands - could produce such incredibly talented young people. #proudtobeparklands

Library book of the week



The latest book written by popular horror writer Alex Bell, in combination with well renowned YA horror publisher Redeye, does not disappoint. The Lighthouse is set on the creepy surroundings of Bird Island off the scottish mainland where nothing is as it seems. The characters are on a working holiday counting seabirds but the island is inhabited by strange ghosts and there are also people from other islands hunting seabirds. Everything hints at dark goings on, threat is always there.

The book is pretty gruesome without being graphic throughout. There are scenes showing people falling off lighthouses, birds pecking people to death, people just disappearing and even eels attacking people from inside. It's pretty unpleasant in places, but that's part of what makes this book so enjoyable for young people. The scares, threat and gore are pitched perfectly for young people, Y8 onwards. The atmosphere, which really important in horror, was just right. Just a brilliant scary book, even I was a bit frightened.

A couple of minor complaints, the epilogue was tacked on to enable a possible sequel. I dislike it when authors do that, they should bury something in the text instead to be dug up at a later date if they want a sequel. And secondly, and with the author seemingly wanting a sequel, why would anyone want to go back to Bird Island when it is such a horrible creepy place? Alex Bell is truly the YA horror master.

Meet your HCRG Care Group 0-19 LHYPFS School Nursing Team (Central)

Universal Reach Team

This team will deliver a universal service to all children and young people with a focus on public health interventions and assessment of health needs. This will include a named link school nurse to each school/college, delivery of the School Health Needs Assessment process and the National Child Measurement Programme in line with the Healthy Child Programme. There will continue to be a Duty practitioner available each weekday to provide support and advice to families and professionals. Requests for support referrals will be triaged by the team and actioned accordingly with individual packages of care provided.

Specialist Services Team

This team will be responsible for providing support to the most vulnerable children and young people including those with complex and additional needs and those in need of protection. Although not directly linked to individual schools the practitioners will work closely with staff in the relevant schools/colleges for which these children and young people attend. The team will attend identified Child Protection, Child in Need meetings, undertaking individual health assessments and providing identified packages of care.
