Dear Parents & Carers,

The written GCSE exams started on Tuesday and yesterday RS was our first full cohort exam. Next week is a full week, with exams every day. We have been really impressed with the conduct of our Year 11s so far and we are sure that this will continue throughout the exam season.

On Friday next week Year 7 will be having a Respect Day, where they will spend the day learning about First Aid. Some of our Year 8 Duke of Edinburgh pupils will also be setting off on their expedition on Friday, so we will have our fingers crossed that the weather will be good for them!

- First occasion pupils will receive a social strike lunchtime detention for 3 days and an email home.
- Second occasion pupils will be placed in inclusion for the day and will stay in school until 4pm.
- Third occasion (and any subsequent occasions) pupils will be suspended.

We are delighted at the majority of Year 11's mature and committed approach to the exams and wish them every success.


Year 7 Respect day - All year 7s will be taking part in a day all about basic first aid, including mental health, next Friday. Pupils will get hands-on experience of techniques like CPR and learn the basics to help them in any emergency situation that may occur.

KS3 - We are absolutely delighted to have our KS3 form captains taking part in a webcast by Asylum Speakers on Tuesday during their Aspire lesson. The pupils will hear from founder Jaz O'Hara and her Eritrean foster brother Meseret Bereket who left his country as an unaccompanied child, making the journey to the UK in order to find safety, and how him joining Jaz's family had a life-changing impact on them both.

After the webcast the pupils will be invited to plan how Parklands should mark A Day of Welcome and Refugee Week in June. They will also be challenged to think about how to make our school a more welcoming place for pupils who are seeking sanctuary or are new to the community.



- This is in addition to the 4 you can gain for this half term



- 3 with 2 points




