Year 11 Messages

On our return after the half-term break Year 11 will receive their first WaG (Working at Grade) Report of the academic year and have their review day on 2nd November. The report will be made available to parents/carers through the app the following day.

Please note that the WaGs reported are a clear indication of how your child is working and the grades produced at the Key Assessment Points during the reporting period (02/09/20 - 06/10/20) and are **not overall predictions**. It is possible that WaGs will vary depending on the effort, application and outcomes in each reporting period.

The reports will also contain a separate 'RAG' rating for Year 11 Assessment Week in each subject that conducted an assessment. Please note the ratings are based on the effort and approach, rather than solely results.

Red = little or no effort, results significantly below what the student is capable of achieving.

Amber = some effort demonstrated but significant room for improvement

Green = well prepared, good effort, positive outcome.

We are pleased at how maturely and conscientiously the majority of Year 11 have approached the return to school and are showing a real engagement and determination in their learning.

Students who graded mainly 'red' will be re-sitting those assessments in the first week back, to give them the opportunity to improve their result.

We've finally reached the end of our first half term back, so well done everybody!! The majority of students have made a great start and the year 7s have settled in so well! We'd like to mention some of the things that have happened this term:

Maths

If you frequently find completing maths homework with your child is a struggle due to either your own maths anxiety or theirs then you may find the following resources useful.

These resources have been created by an educational psychologist that works with one of the maths platforms we use.

1. Free webinar for parents on helping your Maths-anxious child - Click for the link

Using both the latest research and her vast experience in this area, Eadi's educational psychologist will give practical advice on ways parents can help their children with their maths, whether they are struggling with maths anxiety or stuck on their homework. And they'll learn tips for keeping their own maths anxieties at bay too!

The webinar takes place on Wednesday 3rd November at 7:30pm.

2. Free course for Maths-anxious Parents - Click for the link

This is a 25 minutes course made up of 5 short videos. The videos will guide you through ways to help your child with their maths work at home without having to know too much about maths. If you feel that you can't help your child at home because "you are not a maths person" then this course is for you!

3. Free course for Students with Maths anxiety- Click for the link

This is a 30 minute course for your child to complete. It goes through 6 techniques they can use when experiencing anxiety. The techniques range from breathing exercise to maths modelling, whilst keeping a main focus on how your brain is working when experiencing anxiety. The course is made up of 6 short videos and they get a certificate at the end.

COVID update from DfE

Further to the [joint letter to parents](#) from the Secretary of State for Education and the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care on Monday 11 October, we have produced frequently asked questions for schools and further education providers on increased LFD testing to respond to potential outbreaks.

In addition to regular twice-weekly LFD testing, local health teams may advise additional LFD testing at your school or college. For example, if a student is identified as a close contact, they may be asked to take daily LFD tests while they wait for their PCR test result. In this scenario, they should continue to attend school or college as long as their LFD test results remain negative. You may also be advised to conduct a one-off round of LFD testing or daily testing for a group or cohort in secondary schools or colleges where case numbers are very high. This should be done for a minimum of 5 days, increasing to 7 days as necessary to ensure the final LFD test is taken on a school day.

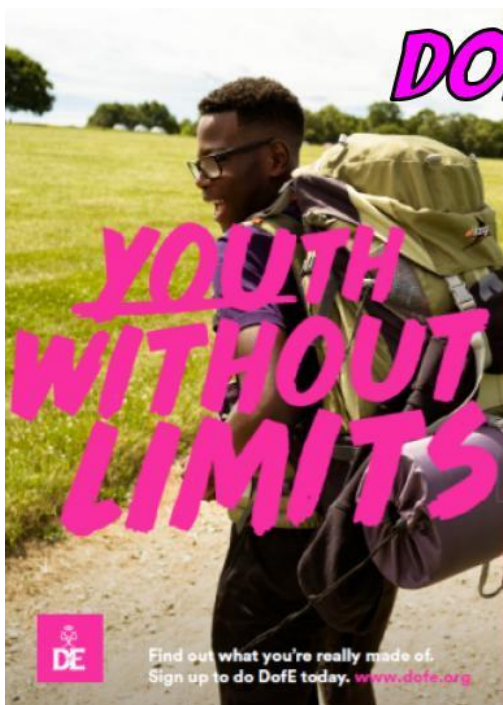

Fireworks, The Law and You



Fireworks can only be purchased from registered sellers for private use between:

15th October - 10th November

26th December - 31st December

3 days before Diwali or Chinese New Year

It is illegal to sell fireworks or sparklers to anyone under 18

It is illegal for anyone under 18 to possess fireworks in public

If you are caught with fireworks in public you could be given an on the spot fine of £80

It is an offence to set off fireworks between 11pm and 7am

It is also an offence to obstruct emergency workers

If you are caught committing any of these offences you could be given an on the spot fine or be taken to court where you can be given a heavier fine or prison sentence.

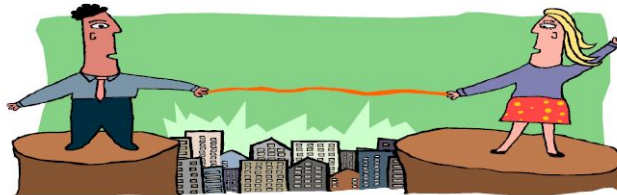
Whole School Messages

Wellbeing for all

I have often offered pertinent explanations to some of the students I have worked with about our language and the significance we levy on certain words when we are explaining or giving an instruction. By replacing the word 'Why?' (which can be interpreted as an adverb, an interjection, a noun or a conjunction) with something else we might elicit a more favorable response. For example changing '**Why did you just do that?**' to '**Should you be doing that?** or '**Am I going to be ok with that?**' means that the person will encode the information differently and so may respond with '**No, I shouldn't be doing...**' or '**Sorry...**'

I use this all the time with my children at home and I find that it has a tendency to de-escalate situations and engage a prefrontal cortex response rather than a full scale amygdala hijack! You could try it with your kids or the students in school.

The infographic below explains a little more about dialect and how we can alter it accordingly.



Creating the Bridge to Middle Ground

How to think and act dialectically



- Move away from "either - or" thinking to "both - and" thinking. Avoid extreme words: "always", "shoulds", "never", "you make me..."
- Practice looking at different sides of a situation and alternative points of view. Find that kernel of truth in each view.
- Remember, there is often no absolute truth. Truth can be found in both sides.
- Other views can be valid even if you don't like or agree with them.
- Don't stand on one side or the other, try to find a middle way between the tension or conflict.
- Practice balancing **acceptance** with **change** by saying things like "This is really hard for me, and I am going to keep trying." "I am doing the best I can, and I am going to try harder".
- Practice sitting with feelings and notice feeling more than one emotion. An example might be: Loving someone and being angry at them at the same time.


