Headteacher's message

Dear parents and carers and students,

COVID vaccinations

As communicated earlier this week, I have agreed Monday 27th September for the Public Health team to administer the vaccines in school to those who have provided consent. I am expecting more information imminently regarding the consent form and further details for you as families so that you are able to make an informed decision. Please do not email school with your consent/non-consent; please wait for the official consent form.

Track and trace

We attended a follow-up call today with the Director for Public Health for Lancashire, who has directed schools to implement the track and trace system again, due to the volume of cases. This means that any close contacts in school will be advised by Mrs Fish to take a PCR test and stay at home until the result is returned. Should we reach a point where the Public Health Team advises us that we have an outbreak, we shall recommend the wearing of face coverings in classrooms and corridors where social distancing is not possible. In addition, if we appear to have a cluster of cases in certain classes, we shall contact the parents/carers of the pupils in those classes and recommend PCR tests as soon as possible.

Last night's Open Evening was a huge success - and that is mainly thanks to the amazing prefects who provided tours for the year 6 pupils. We were incredibly impressed with the prefects about whom we have had nothing but praise from the visitors. 
- YOU ARE BEING ASSESSED!
- (BRONZE PUPILS) Arrive at school on the Saturday 24th September 2021 with ALL your equipment. Put equipment with your groups in N26.
- At break please collect your equipment and head to the bus bays.
- You need to bring food to cook on your stove as well as Friday lunch, You must bring any utensils you need. Consider very carefully that you are carrying this food with you on your walk. You need to be FULLY SELF SUFFICIENT - YOU ARE BEING ASSESSED THAT DAY - You will have access to water.
- You should be wearing WALKING BOOTS not wellies or trainers. All items have to go in your rucksack no carrying items by hand.
