Attendance - This week a whole school exercise was done to highlight attendance to parents/guardians who's children's attendance falls below 90%. In total over 300 letters were sent.

The Department of Education classes any child below 90% for whatever reason as persistently absent.

As a school we have a legal obligation to highlight attendance and track it throughout the year. So this exercise will be repeated several times throughout this academic year.

In December the reward trip will be running and any student who falls below the required 93% attendance will be ineligible for the trip. This first letter distribution is to highlight current attendance and flag that if your child wishes to attend the reward trip the distance they are away from the required target. At this time in the year every day does really count, each AM or PM session carries a heavy percentage at this time of the academic year.

LANCASHIRE HOPE HACK

On Friday 22nd September a group of students selected from years 10 & 11 represented Parklands to engage in the Lancashire Hope Hack.

A Hope Hack is a day-long workshop that aims to give young people aged 15-25 a voice and focuses on their hopes for the future. This involves groups discussing their thoughts and solutions on issues that affect them, their lives and their communities.

Over the last two years, the Hope Collective have been running a series of Hope Hack events across the length and breadth of the UK. The Hope Collective formed to support the campaign for Damilola Taylor, a 10-year-old boy who wrote of his hope to change the world, shortly before his untimely death in 2000. Hope Hack events honour his memory by dedicating the campaign to young people and their aspirational stories of ambition and hope. The Hope Collective aim to establish real change that enables the UK's most vulnerable communities to be free from poverty, violence and discrimination.

The group of 8 students attended Evolution House for the conference. A very modern business building designed for a software company, the students were amazed at the facilities available to the staff who usually worked there, including a tube slide which enabled staff to get from the second floor down to the ground floor in only a few seconds!

The day consisted of some poems from Author, Spoken Artist, Youth Worker and Northerner, Nathan Parker

A very interesting talk followed from Ashley John-Baptiste; a young journalist and presenter about how he overcame his difficult start in life to go on to study at a top university and pursue a career in media. Ashley has performed on the X Factor live shows, reported at the FIFA World Cup in 2018 and creates documentaries on issues he is passionate about, such as 'Care Home Kids: Looking for Love'.

Our students were asked to discuss and present on the topic of the cost of living crisis, and why this might affect the life chances of young people. The group worked really well together and presented their thoughts to the audience of over 120 young people, teachers, community and youth workers. Also there to watch was the High Sheriff of Lancashire Mr David Taylor.

It was an absolute pleasure to spend the day with May, Lucas, Finlay, Tom, Matilda, Mariam, Jacob and George. They worked really well as a group and they all made really valid and thoughtful contributions to the day. Their presentation gave a lot of good ideas and was very well received, especially the humorous sketches they performed.


As a school we are getting behind local initiatives and charities.

Purpose of the role

The role is strategic rather than operational. Trustees do not get involved with the day to day running of the school, but instead support and challenge the school's leadership teams to drive school improvement.





Confidentiality

We might inform someone if we are concerned about the safety of you, your child or someone else but we would usually speak to you first. Your messages are stored and can be seen by other healthcare staff who follow the same confidentiality rules. We aim to reply to you within one working day and you should get an immediate message back to confirm we have received your text. Texts will only be seen between 9am and 5pm Monday to Friday (excluding bank holidays).
