

PARENT BULLETIN 16 Nov - 20 Nov 2020: Week 2



Dear parents and carers,

Many of you may already be aware that since our return from half-term we have seen an increase in the number of pupils displaying COVID symptoms in school. We have acted as soon as possible, from isolating pupils in school until they could be collected to sending a large number of year 9 pupils home due to having been identified as close contacts of positive cases. Last night we were informed of another positive case in year 9, and we immediately informed parents to ensure their child remained at home today. Thank you to all involved for your immediate understanding of the situation. This morning Mrs Batson and Mrs Fish spent a considerable amount of time contacting the Local Authority, Public Health England and the North West Public Health Team to determine our next course of action.

Due to the number of recent cases in year 9 we have been advised to isolate the whole year group for 14 days. Parents and carers should have received an email from school with further details. Whilst this is regrettable, it is essential that we follow all advice and guidance to safeguard our school community. We have been very fortunate as a school so far in that this is the first instance of us needing to isolate a year group. Thankfully, due to our use of Google Classroom and our experience with Google Meet and other technologies, we are fully able to move immediately to blended learning, a mix of online lessons supplemented with additional work.

It is however incumbent on all of us to ensure we adhere to the guidelines regarding necessary actions when pupils display symptoms, however mild. Please ensure you do not send your child to school if they are displaying any of the 3 main symptoms: a new continuous cough, a temperature or loss of taste or sense of smell. We are frequently sending pupils home before 10am, but we recognise that many of you may have already left for work before your children get up. This is the case in my own household, so please ensure your children are able to contact you if they believe they may have symptoms. This will protect everyone else in school and help us to ensure we can keep school open to as many pupils as possible for as long as possible.

I have been sent some very useful little booklets from *LawCareers.net:* 'The Law - Apprenticeships Guide 2021' and 'The Beginners Guide to a Career in Law 2021' - if anyone would like one, drop me an email (Miss Berry).

Year 11 watched a short presentation on T-Levels earlier this week. These are the latest qualifications available in colleges and sixth forms, which bridge the gap between academic and practical skills. Students spend 80% of the course in the classroom and 20% on the job training with an employer (315 hours). They are a Level 3 qualification, meaning they are directly equivalent to A Levels. Three subjects were introduced in 2020 with a further seven to be launched in 2021, including: Building services engineering, Digital business services, Digital support and services, Health, Healthcare science, Onsite construction and Science, with another fourteen to be offered in 2022/23. Please note that A Levels and BTECs are still available - these are an alternative. Apprenticeship Notifications

For anyone interested in an apprenticeship, now is the time to start looking. You can register at https://www.gov.uk/apply-apprenticeship. Complete the registration page and click to receive notifications (anytime a relevant vacancy appears). Some companies take months to get through applications and some close their application windows just after Christmas, so don't hang about! BAE Systems, MBDA and others are already accepting applications - a last minute application is unlikely to be successful.

You should always apply for a full time college course as well, just in case (even if you have a firm offer of an apprenticeship. As we have seen this year, things can change very quickly).
