When do GCSE exams finish? This is question we are regularly asked by both students and parents as this may be your first opportunity in years to take advantage of a holiday in term time! The exams regulator advises all GCSE candidates to not take a holiday until 25th June; this is just in case there is a national issue with an exam and it has to be rescheduled.

At the end of this half-term we will be moving into the final stage of Elevate, our year 11 study skills programme. The aim of the year long programme is to develop proven skills that equip and enable our students to access different methods of revision and prepare for their forthcoming examinations. By this point, we have created a wealth of revision resources for every subject and students are encouraged to take responsibility for their revision and develop independence. After the half-term break subject revision sessions will cease in their current format and we will be providing a study space every night from 3-4pm where students can complete private, independent study; this will be in addition to those students who are expected to attend period 6. There is the possibility that subject specific intervention sessions will be offered for targeted students in identified areas but parents will be contacted directly if this is required.
