Your child will probably tell you about our plans to have a school dog. There is a lot of research to support the role of having a pet dog in schools, helping with both emotional and academic development. Our dog will be based in the Intervention room under the care of Ms Mulligan at all times; she will not be roaming around the school building. Children who are not comfortable with dogs have no need to interact with her at all, and if such a child needs to go into Intervention, then we will remove the dog from the room. She will be used in one-to-one sessions by Ms Mulligan and her role will develop as she is trained and grows. We have selected a poodle as our therapy dog. This breed is very sociable, intelligent and loves to be around people. Poodles are also the most hypoallergenic dog you can own as they do not lose their fur.
