Dear parents and carers,



Unfortunately, I have noticed a recent spike in disrespectful, aggressive and rude communication (primarily emails) received by my colleagues or me, which have resulted in a temporary <u>communication ban</u> for the parents/carers with school. Whilst this is deeply regrettable and is certainly not in the child's best interests, my staff and I do not deserve to be treated in such a way. We have a number of ways for parents/carers to raise legitimate concerns, which will be dealt with in a respectful and courteous manner. I am sure all parents/carers expect professional, courteous dialogue from school staff, but school staff have the same expectations of

We need your full support in order to ensure your child is as best prepared as they can be to meet the demands of life after Parklands.


Please note from September all school ties bought via the school office will be charged at £7 in line with the charges at NU uniform.
