Lancashire Constabulary Money Mule Campaign 2019. Click here to read a letter we've been asked to share with parents/carers. In 2018, there were 5,819 cases of young people aged 14-18 using their bank accounts for money muling in the UK, figures from Cifas show. This is a rise of 27 per cent on 2017 (4,849 cases) and a 73 percent increase since 2016 (3,360 cases). Young people are often unaware that acting as a money mule is illegal. They are approached to take part online or in person, including through social media, at school, college or sports clubs.

Guidance from the Department for Education regarding BREXIT:

The EU Settlement Scheme

School should inform any staff, parents or carers of pupils who are EU, EEA or Swiss citizens that they need to apply to the EU Settlement Scheme to continue living in the UK after 2020.

Read the guidance on **EU Settlement Scheme** to find out who needs to apply.

Irish citizens' right to live in the UK will not change when the UK leaves the EU. Irish citizens do not need to apply for the EU Settlement Scheme, but their family members, who are not Irish or British citizens, will need to.
