Aspirational Futures Multi-Academy Trust

I am pleased to report that our new Trust went live on Wednesday this week. The website is available to view here although it is a work in progress and will be updated at regular intervals. Currently, Parklands is the only school in the Trust but both Balshaw Lane and Highfield Community primary schools can now proceed with their applications, as the new name is now registered with Companies House. We hope they will be fully onboard by September at the latest, although we have already started to work with them much more closely.
