Headteacher's Message

Dear parents, carers and students,

On Monday I held an assembly for all pupils in years 7 - 10 during which I talked about the changes to leadership at Parklands from September 2023, due to our successful approval to form our own Multi-Academy Trust, Aspirational Futures. From previous bulletins you may be aware that I shall be leading the Trust as CEO and Executive Headteacher of Parklands, but this change in role will mean I will be unable to lead Parklands as I have done since my appointment in September 2017. This week both Balshaw Lane and Highfield Community primary schools received confirmation that their applications to become academies and join our Trust have been approved, which we are clearly delighted about. It is, therefore, the right time for me to handover the day-to-day leadership of Parklands to Mrs Batson by the end of this term. Mrs Batson has worked alongside me on the Senior Leadership Team since I joined Parklands back in 2009; she is a strong, dynamic leader whose leadership of teaching and learning has contributed hugely to Parklands' improvement in GCSE outcomes, with last year's Progress 8 score being our school's best ever. As Executive Headteacher and CEO, I shall be based here at Parklands and will continue to work very closely with Mrs Batson to ensure our school remains at the forefront of teaching & learning and student support, and that Parklands students continue to attend what I always call *the best school in Chorley*.
