Headteacher's Message

Dear parents, carers and students,

Sad farewells

Today two members of Parklands staff are moving on to pastures new. Miss Cambridge, Drama teacher, came to us on supply a few months ago, and she had a hugely positive impact on day one. Miss Cambridge is moving on to a permanent position at another school from next week, so we wish her all the best in her new role.

Mrs Ardern, Deputy Headteacher, also finishes at Parklands today although she is remaining part of our community. Mrs Ardern will be taking up the role of temporary Headteacher at Walton-le-Dale High School, which may become a member school in our Multi-Academy Trust. Mrs Ardern will spend the next two weeks getting to know the school before officially taking up the role from after the Easter break. Mrs Ardern has worked at Parklands for about 8 years during which time she has consistently had a phenomenal impact in our school and specifically in the Maths department. As Executive Headteacher I shall be working closely with Mrs Ardern, supporting her in her new role, in addition to other members of Parklands who will collaborate with colleagues at Walton-le-Dale in order to help the school on its improvement journey. Mrs Ardern will be sorely missed at Parklands, but we wish her all the very best at this exciting stage of her career.

Unavoidable School Closure

Following last Friday's closure, I consulted with the school's governors regarding our procedure for closing the school in adverse weather. The updated procedure is <u>here</u>. When I made the decision to close last Friday, I honestly thought it was the best decision to make at the time with the information I had. My suggestion to governors, which was approved, was to push the decision making on to 7.30am (at the earliest) rather than 7am. I fully acknowledge that we were the only school in Chorley to close, so I hope this amendment to our policy will help me (or any future headteacher) with the decision making process.

Enquiry Question - What does it mean to be a Jew in the 21st century?

Current Unit - The History of Christianity Enquiry Question - Who was the real Jesus?

- 1. What is the significance of Roman historian Cornelius Tacitus' writings about Jesus?
- 2. How reliable is Tactitus as a source? Justify your answer.
- 3. What is the significance of Jewish historian Flavius Josephus' writings about Jesus?
- 4. How reliable is Josephus as a source? Justify your answer.

Current Unit - The History of Christianity

- 1. What effect did Emperor Nero have on the way that people viewed Christians? How did he help the cause for Christians?
- 2. What was the Great Schism of 1054?
- 3. What factors contributed to the Great Schism happening?



The 'School to Work' programme, offered by the local NHS Trust, means that up to 20 Year 10 students can take part in a work experience week at Chorley Hospital. Places are rapidly being filled, so if you would like to take part in this for your WEX week, please let me know. There will be tours of different departments, sessions with various healthcare professionals and Q&A opportunities. As it is normally very difficult to find WEX in the hospital (and impossible to get clinical experience for Year 10s) this seems like a perfect solution for anyone interested in a career within the NHS.
