Headteacher's Message

Dear parents, carers and students,

Earlier this week I emailed you all regarding communication with school, a copy of which is on the next 2 pages of this bulletin.

I would like to express my sincere gratitude to the surprisingly large number of parents/carers who took the time to email me back, giving their full support for our stance whilst also expressing their disappointment that I felt the need to have to send such an email. Thank you so much. We are currently in somewhat of a recruitment crisis within education, where it is not easy to fill vacancies, which many schools are currently experiencing. Children suffer when this happens, and I do not want to be in a position where I cannot find a replacement for a member of staff who resigns due to the level of abuse directed at him/her. I fully acknowledge that none of us are perfect and we all make mistakes; should you have any issues or concern with school, I would urge you not to put your frustrations into an email but respectfully give us the chance to rectify any wrongdoing.

Staggered lunches

From Monday next week we are implementing a system of staggered lunches. As a heavily oversubscribed school, we have now reached a point where we cannot continue to have one lunch setting for the whole school and some students are experiencing lengthy queue times before they can get anything to eat from the canteen. Outside space is also limited at lunchtime, especially in wet weather with the field being out of use. We will explain the system to all students on Monday morning during form time.

Thank you to everyone for their support with this worthy cause. Today we raised an incredible £930!!

School funding

You may be aware from the national press that, thankfully, school funding has not been cut by the Chancellor. This should result in Parklands being able to continue with our current provision. We are also in a very fortunate position of having secured a fantastic fixed deal on our utilities before the huge increase in gas and electricity costs - so our heating is on!

Headteacher's Message

Dear parents and carers,

Please take this communication in the spirit in which it is intended.

I am writing to you today to seek your support regarding communication with school. Recently, we have noticed a large increase in the number of rude, aggressive and inappropriate emails or phone calls into school. In addition to this, we are finding that some parents and carers expect responses late in the evening and are then re-emailing the member of staff when a response has not been received.

As headteacher of Parklands, it is my responsibility to put measures in place to support everyone's wellbeing; this applies to students and staff. We have all experienced a global pandemic; we have all struggled with lockdown, working at home, not seeing colleagues and friends, not being able to do what we usually could do. Now we seem to be on the other side of the pandemic, we have to return to business-as-usual in school. This means we have to reinforce our standards and expectations, so that school can run smoothly and the children are well supported.

In order to support my staff, who will then in turn support your children, I need your support in ensuring communication remains polite and respectful. My staff should not have to tolerate abuse. Whilst the overwhelming majority of phone calls or emails are polite and respectful, a minority are not. At the end of every phone line or email is a mother, father, son or daughter, but above all someone who has chosen to work in a school with children, in order to give children - your children - the best possible start in life. The main receivers of abuse are:

- 1. Mrs Fish, Attendance Officer, whose role is to implement the national guidance on attendance in school. Last week she had 4 abusive emails and so far this week she has had two abusive emails and one abusive phone call. Attendance is a national priority for the Department for Education as it has reduced significantly following COVID. Whilst Parklands' attendance figures are above the national average of 92.2%*, the national absence rate of 7.8%*is a significant cause for concern for the Department for Education. Mrs Fish is simply doing her job regarding attendance at Parklands. Please respect this.
- 2. The House Achievement Leaders, whose role is to support all children in their respective Houses so that they leave Parklands as successful young adults.
- 3. The Receptionists, who are the first people to answer the phones and help direct your call to the appropriate colleague or answer any questions you may have.

It is not our intention to come into conflict with any parents or carers. But we must uphold rules and regulations set by the Department for Education and the Local Authority. We must uphold our high standards in order to provide the type of school environment in which your children can thrive.

I am therefore asking for all contact with school to be polite and respectful.

Measures I will take if contact is abusive are as follows:

- Reminders regarding polite contact with school;
- Warning letters issued;
- Blocking all emails into school;
- Blocking phone numbers;
- Accepting letters only into school, which will be returned to the sender unanswered if they are abusive;
- Barring people from the school site.





From the 1st December the charity prefects will be visiting forms selling the Derian House Christmas Furry Friends, festive cuddle cups with keyrings. They are £4 each. All proceeds go to Derian House Children's Hospice to help them continue the incredible work they do helping children and young people, whose lives are too short, to make happy memories in an environment of fun, respect and above all, outstanding care.

The care they provide is free for families, but services cost £5.7 million to run every year with only 17% of funding they need coming from the government.



LOCK IT OR LOSE IT



- The average value of a stolen bike is over £250. A bike lock costs as little as £8.00.
- The school has 2 bike rack stands. One behind the Music Block and one by the Pupil Entrance.
- All pupils must place their bikes in the stands provided and securely lock the bike to the stand.
- No bikes or scooters should be placed near the Refectory fire doors. This is a serious breach of Health and Safety and bikes will be removed from this area.
- It is in your interest to follow the procedures and use the facilities provided by the school.
- Fact—Just 1 in 5 bike owners are able to provide their bicycle frame number to the police when reporting their bike as stolen.


