Headteacher's Message

Dear parents and carers,

This has felt like an incredibly long half-term; the days have been dark, the weather has been poor, we've been struggling with COVID cases amongst students and staff, and we are all feeling tired. Thank goodness we have a week off to recuperate.

Standards

Since we returned after Christmas we have unfortunately noticed a deterioration in standards amongst some of our students. As COVID restrictions are lifted and we return to normality, it is our duty to reinforce the standards we expect of our students which will help shape them into well-rounded young adults. It appears that COVID has led to a general a lack of manners and respect which we need to address more strongly when we return. I would like to refer to our non-negotiables moving forward:

- All coats, jackets, hoodies, scarves and jewellery should be removed when students enter school. When we return on Monday, 21st February we expect such items to be stored in lockers throughout the day. We have a uniform for a reason, so that no student feels disadvantaged if their family cannot afford the latest fashions. Some students are proudly wearing their expensive items inside our very warm building, and this needs to stop. If your child does not have a locker, they can obtain one from the school office. Failure to comply will result in sanctions.
- Blazers. These are to be worn at all times, unless a member of staff has given permission.
 Our school is warm but not excessively so. Failure to comply will result in sanctions.
- Shoes. Our uniform policy is clear on the type of shoes we expect (see extract below).
 Failure to comply will result in sanctions.
 - Sensible black leather or leather effect shoes. No trainers, boots, high heels or canvas footwear.
- Manners. There has been a decline in manners and respect amongst some students who are
 questioned by staff due to missing uniform items or due to their behaviour. I expect all my
 staff to reinforce our school standards and I expect all students to respond appropriately.
 Rudeness will not be tolerated. Failure to comply will result in sanctions.

I hope all parents and carers can understand our need to reinforce standards. We pride ourselves on educating children holistically; in addition to good qualifications our young people need to learn how to respond appropriately and conform to rules, so that they are well prepared for the world of work. I am proud of the <u>overwhelming majority</u> of Parklands students whose behaviour and attitudes are exemplary; they say please and thank you, they address everyone with respect, they are tolerant of others and their differences, they are grateful for the support and opportunities we offer, their uniform is perfect, and they are always well-equipped for lessons. I am confident that all parents and carers expect such a school environment for their child and that our standards mirror your standards.

Headteacher's Message

As I always state at Open Evenings, we cannot do this alone. We want, need and expect all the parents and carers of our students to support us in upholding our high standards. We do not have unrealistic expectations, and to maintain our good reputation and continue providing a caring, supportive, calm and orderly school, we need everyone to pull together.

On a lighter note, I am looking forward to watching tonight's Parklands Got Talent final. After such a long time of being unable to hold such events, it is wonderful to see our school start to resemble the fantastic school we were pre-COVID. I had the pleasure of watching the recent production of Elf and observing the pleasure and joy on our students' faces. It is fantastic to see so many students get involved with the extra-curricular activities we have been able to offer again, and I hope even more students will be encouraged to join in as the weather improves.

This is to inform you that on **Monday 21st February** a presentation will be delivered in school to the year group on knife crime. This has been sponsored and promoted by Chorley Council (Public Protection) and the Police and has already been delivered to many high schools in the Chorley and South Ribble area. You may have seen in the news recently, the knife statue which was at Blackburn and is now up in Barrow in a bid to raise awareness about knife crime and the impact it has on young people and their families.

The JJEffect is an award winning anti-knife campaign delivered by Byron Highton whose brother Jon-Jo was tragically murdered in 2014 in a gang related attack. Since the attack, Byron has campaigned against knife crime in a bid to spare other families from suffering the trauma him and his family have endured.

There will be an opportunity for students to ask questions and to talk to staff after the presentation, if they have any worries or concerns.




