Headteacher's Message

Dear parents, carers and students,

Please read the information below which I received yesterday. At Parklands we are still experiencing high levels of positive cases amongst our students, so I would like to encourage the continued use of face coverings. Clearly, I cannot make this compulsory, but we would welcome your support. Currently, we have over 70 students isolating at home, with the majority in Year 10, and we are still experiencing some staff absences.

An update from the <u>Department for Education</u> for all education and childcare settings following the Prime Minister's announcement of the end of Plan B

The Prime Minister announced that all Plan B measures will be removed in England, with a full return to Plan A by Thursday 27 January.

In education and childcare settings, this means:

From Thursday 20 January, face coverings are no longer recommended in classrooms and teaching spaces for staff, and pupils and students in year 7 and above. They were introduced in classrooms at the start of the spring term as a temporary measure.

From Thursday 27 January, face coverings are no longer recommended in communal areas for staff, and pupils and students in year 7 and above.

This decision comes in response to national infection data showing the prevalence of COVID-19 to be on a downward trajectory. Whilst there are some groups where cases are likely to continue rising, it is likely that the Omicron wave has now peaked nationally. There remains significant pressure on the NHS but hospital admissions have stabilised, and the number of patients in Intensive Care Units (ICU) remain low and are falling.

This means it is right we remove the most stringent restrictions around wearing face coverings from education, but the virus is still with us, and continuing with proportionate protective measures remains vital to protect education.

Local directors of public health are able to recommend the use of face coverings in communal areas, across their area only, where DfE and public health experts judge the measure to be proportionate due to specific health concerns. This is a temporary measure. Directors of public health will continue to advise individual settings experiencing outbreaks. Any local introduction of face coverings will be subject to routine review and removed at the earliest opportunity.

Should the COVID situation continue to improve, we are looking forward to resuming our usual activities, such as holding assemblies, putting on more productions such as our Dance Show, and we have started planning for our Learning Challenge Week and Year 10 Work Experience in July.

WELLBEING

Dear pupils, parents and carers,

I am very aware that some of our pupils (and families) are struggling with low mood, motivation and anxiety and have disconnected a little from their families, friends and school. Below is a service that I highly recommend.

I wanted to remind you that the Kooth is a platform that can support young people with absolutely anything. Just to remind you how Kooth operates: A young person is signposted to the platform, not referred. They are not always ready to tell someone in school or at home that they are struggling. Kooth provides the autonomy for young people to set the pace.

Young people can make a Kooth account very simply in less than two minutes and receive counselling support in the same day from a qualified counsellor. They can access a digital chat, up to one hour each week up to 10pm at night.

Although we have the use of a counselling service with Mr Pilling and our weekly drop-in with the school nurse, we still have waiting times, as with all other services such as CAMHS. With KOOTH you can feel assured that young people can also reach out to Kooth during the evening, weekends and school holidays.

Many young people sitting in their room alone develop overwhelming feelings of anxiety and resort to self-harm as a means of managing this. Kooth.com can be there at that point of need and offer the support to manage that anxiety. Young people are provided with tried and tested alternative tools and resources. There is lots of advice around how to support your son/daughter/yourself with exams.

Kooth can also guide young people to connect with others who feel the same way in moderated forums and access thousands of magazine articles that have been submitted by young people. They can develop a safety plan with one of KOOTH's qualified counsellors to help them manage any escalation in their mental health.

Thank you for taking the time to read and I hope it helps.
