



COMPLETING YOUR FIRST CV

Writing your first CV can be difficult, especially when you are unsure of what needs to go into it. A CV is all about showing your potential employer what you have managed to achieve so far in your life.

What you need in your CV:

- Education
- Qualifications
- Experience
- Skills

Qualities

Knowledge

The layout of your CV is important; separating

- information into sections is
 - a must.
- Contact Details

And don't be afraid to add a little bit of detail in each of these sections.

CONTACT DETAILS

Your contact details should always be at the top of your CV. This is so that should your potential employer want to give you an interview, it is easy for them to find out how to get in contact with you.

- Always give your full address in case the employer wants to invite you to an interview by letter.
- Give your mobile number and your landline (if you have one), this way the employer has plenty of ways to contact you.
- Add your email address as this makes organising an interview quicker.

PERSONAL PROFILE

Sitting just under the contact details, your personal profile is usually between four to six lines long and acts as an introduction to your CV.

- Take this opportunity to tell the employer what is unique about you.
- State why you are suitable for the job.

Section & QUALIFICATIONS

Stating your qualifications is important for the employer, so make sure that the information is clear and concise by setting out the subjects and grades, and when you took the exams.

- If you are still waiting for your results, make sure to let the employer know on your CV (eg awaiting results due August).
- If you are working towards further qualifications, be sure to supply that information as well.

EXPERIENCE

Here you should supply any work experience that you have gained, be it paid or unpaid.

- Full time or part time work, permanent or temporary should be included.
- If you have done any work experience or work placements.
- Voluntary work or internships.

INTERESTS

Your interests don't always have to be included on your CV, but it does provide the employer with a bit more information about you. Relevant interests may help you to get the job!

- Include clubs that you may be a part of, for example coaching, sport or theatre.
- You can also include hobbies such as reading, music and films maybe adding the genre you particularly like and why.

A quick reminder that the NHS Allied Work Experience Programme is still available for students in years 10 and 11, running one weekend a month.

All students will be awarded with a Work Experience Certificate for participating in the day. This is something that they can include in their UCAS and Apprenticeship Applications. The next Work Experience day will cover the following healthcare careers:

- Nursing
- Midwifery
- Paramedicine
- Physiotherapy
- Occupational Therapy
- Dietetics
- Radiography
- Prosthetics and Orthotics
- Speech and language therapy
- Pharmacy

The virtual work experience day will take place through an online portal and run LIVE from 10am-5pm, following 2 patients from their initial accidents through to recovery. Students will see them interact with a variety of healthcare professionals listed above so that they develop an understanding of the multidisciplinary team as well as insights into their own chosen career.

Students will also have the opportunity to interact with the healthcare professionals via a LIVE Chat function and polls throughout the day!

The cost to attend is £10/student per session, which is just an administrative cost to cover the set-up of individual portals, personalised certificates, safeguarding, the technology on the day, such as our servers and chat functions.

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Public Relations Officer

- Public relations officers manage the reputation and image of their clients, working to gain public understanding and support through planned publicity campaigns
- A career in public relations (PR) involves using all forms of media and communication to build, maintain and manage the reputation of your clients. These range from public bodies or services, to businesses and voluntary organisations.
- You'll communicate key messages, often using third-party endorsements, to defined target audiences in order to establish and maintain goodwill and understanding between an organisation and its public. This may be between organisations (business-to-business, or B2B) or individuals, and the general public.
- As a PR officer or PR account executive, you'll monitor publicity and conduct research to find out the concerns and expectations of your client organisation's stakeholders. You'll then report and explain the findings to its management.

Responsibilities

As a public relations officer, you'll need to:

- work as part of an account team (in smaller organisations you may be the sole PR lead or work as an agency PR officer) where you'll plan, develop and implement PR strategies
- build strong relationships and networks with colleagues, clients and the media and answer enquiries from the media and other organisations
- monitor the media, including newspapers, magazines, journals, broadcasts, newswires, social media sites and blogs, for opportunities for clients
- research, write and distribute press releases to targeted media
- collate and analyse media coverage
- write and edit in-house magazines, case studies, speeches, articles and annual reports
- prepare and supervise the production of publicity brochures, handouts, direct mail leaflets, promotional videos, photographs, films and multimedia programmes
- devise photo opportunities and coordinate studio or location photography
- organise events (such as press conferences, exhibitions, open days and press tours), source speakers and seek out sponsorship opportunities
- maintain and update information on the organisation's website
- manage and update information and engage with users on social media sites such as Twitter and Facebook
- prepare regular client reports and attend client meetings
- commission market research
- undertake research for new business proposals and present them to potential new clients
- foster good community relations through events such as open days and through involvement in community initiatives
- manage the PR aspect of a potential crisis situation.
