

Stemming the flood

Hiba Khan keeps people's homes safe from flooding and erosion.



I'm Hiba. I work at Mott MacDonald, and I'm an engineer on a mission to keep people safe and healthy by protecting their homes and environments.

The project I think that means the most to me is the one that I'm still working on at the moment. It's a project in Bangladesh and it's to combat river erosion. In Bangladesh 20 percent of the country floods every single year on average. They've got these huge rivers. They're like 16 kilometres wide. They can erode 900 metres over the year. That's like a whole village has just fallen into the river all of a sudden, which obviously is catastrophic for health.

So our project aims to reduce that riverbank erosion by stopping it in certain places. The great thing about the project for people's health is that once you stop the water coming in and stop their houses flooding you don't get as much standing water which obviously is a breeding ground for mosquitos, malaria and all sorts of diseases. Also if the roads are there and permanent they can always get medical supplies in and take people out who need help.

This is one of the things that we use a lot on site. It's called a geo bag. So Bangladesh doesn't have many rocks, and normally you'd use rocks to stop riverbank erosion, but we have to make our own. We fill these with sand, we stitch the top, and we push then out of barges and they fall in layers underwater to protect against erosion.

Engineering makes me really happy. It was really important to me to feel like I'm part of something that's working towards the greater good, and I really feel like that in engineering. You can see what you've done at the end of the project, which is great.

If you have star quality and dreams to work on both stage and screen, then working in the industry can give you a good starting point to a life in lights.

A career in the performing arts can not just prepare you for roles working in the theatre, film and music industries, but your skills can be transferred to a range of other careers, combining creative talent with the practical aspect of arts management. There are a wide range of careers and locations to explore, from broadcast and media systems engineer to the more diverse, such as a cultural learning and participation officer at a museum or props technician for film, television and theatre.

Here is a selection of apprenticeships on offer that all have a focus on the subject of music or drama at their core.

Acoustics technician: Carry out noise and vibration surveying and testing in a variety of different situations. The duration is 24 months and you'll achieve a level 4 apprenticeship upon completion.

Arts therapist: Use art, drama or music to carry out therapy interventions to improve a person's mental, physical health and wellbeing. The duration is 24 months and you'll achieve a level 7 degree apprenticeship upon completion.

Broadcast and media systems engineer: Ensure that content is broadcast and delivered on time and to the highest level of quality. The duration is 36 months and you'll achieve a level 6 degree apprenticeship upon completion.

Creative industries production manager: Responsible for all the organisational aspects of the production schedule and budget. The duration is 18 months and you'll achieve a level 7 degree apprenticeship upon completion.

Creative venue technician: You'll provide technical support for the construction, rehearsal, presentation and removal of a live performance or event. The duration is 24 months and you'll achieve a level 3 apprenticeship upon completion.

Cultural learning and participation officer: Plan, organise and coordinate artistic and cultural education programmes and community engagement projects. The duration is 15 months and you'll achieve a level 3 apprenticeship upon completion.

Health play specialist: Provide therapeutic play for sick children, young people, carers and families of all ages. The duration is 24 months and you'll achieve a level 5 apprenticeship upon completion.

Props technician: Source, organise, maintain and make props for film, television and theatre productions. The duration is 18 months and you'll achieve a level 3 apprenticeship upon completion.

Dentist

Dentists prevent and treat problems affecting the mouth and teeth, deal with injuries and correct dental issues

As a dentist, you'll typically lead a team of dental nurses, hygienists, therapists and technicians, and treat a range of patients, from children to the elderly.

The most common role in dentistry is as a general dental practitioner (GDP). As a GDP, you'll work as a self-employed contractor providing dental care to the general public in high street practices. It's also possible to work part time in hospitals. You might provide services under the NHS, privately or both.

Types of dentistry

You may choose to specialise in a different area of dentistry, such as:

- Community dental care working in patients' homes, nursing homes and community clinics, treating patients who have special requirements that mean they can't attend a high street practice.
- Dental public health carrying out non-clinical work, assessing the dental health needs of populations rather than individuals.
- Hospital dental care dealing with cases of special difficulty and providing treatment to long-stay hospital patients, emergency treatment for shortstay patients or the general public for teaching purposes.
- Armed forces providing a comprehensive range of dental services for armed forces personnel in the UK and abroad, operating as a military dental officer.

Responsibilities

As a dentist, you'll need to:

- educate patients on oral healthcare
- examine teeth, diagnosing dental conditions using tools such as x-rays
- assess treatment options and agree treatment plans with patients
- carry out agreed clinical treatments such as restoring teeth affected by decay and treating gum disease
- maintain patients' dental records
- recruit, train and manage staff
- oversee budgets and maintain stocks of equipment
- market services to potential clients

Some practices employ practice managers so that dentists can concentrate on clinical work.
