FUTURE RAILWAY ENGINEERING (VIRTUAL)

Heavyweight, high-speed trains transport people across the globe - connecting families, transporting goods, and keeping the world moving. These huge, complex machines must be extremely secure to protect their passengers and cargo.

Students on this course will work in teams to build and crash a scale-model train, testing how their design responds to stress and learning what it takes to be a rail safety engineer. This course is for Years 11/12 England and Wales, S5/6 Scotland and Year 12/13 Northern Ireland.

Using your smartphone, you will record the crash and analyse the footage to see how your design protects passengers. This course combines fun, interactive learning online with access to leading academics from the University of Birmingham, and the chance to learn more about a career in engineering.

How to answer the 'Tell me about a time when...?' Interview question

When you go into an interview, you can never really be sure about what the interviewer may or may not ask you. Being prepared for anything can really help calm your nerves but for some reason, you may find yourself scrambling for words when the interviewer asks a question starting with 'tell me about a time when?' You may have prepared, but sometimes, we forget what we're about to say and go with something else. There is a good plan for answering these types of questions, keep reading below to find out how you can be as prepared as possible and stop those nerves hitting you as soon as questions like this are asked.

Why do employers choose these questions?

It's always good to understand why you are being asked these questions, to ensure that you are giving them the best possible answer, enabling you to show them your strengths and experience. 'Tell me about a time' questions are behavioural questions. They are asked to encourage you to not only discuss your skills but focus on a specific time or experience in your personal or professional life.

The interviewer is looking for you to give an answer that follows with an example. This makes it more of an open answer where you can discuss an experience and how it impacted you in that moment. Employers want to know your skills and how you have put them into practice and whether you would be a good fit for their team. They may ask you questions about both positive and negative experiences, but it's important that you always stay positive throughout. You can discuss how you overcame issues but never talk yourself down.

How to start answering these questions?

These kinds of questions need to have stories. You need to think of a time when you were actually put in that situation and go from there. The STAR method is a good way of answering these types of questions.

Situation - Think of a time when ...

Task - What was the task at hand?

Action - What did you do in this situation?

Result - What was the outcome?

One of the main reasons we may feel nervous when these questions are asked, is because we either haven't prepared for the exact question they have asked, or we can't think of a time where we were actually put in the situation they have asked for. It's important to know that these questions don't always have to be answered with experiences in the workplace. We are more than our jobs and life experiences also make you who you are.

Questions you may be asked

It's likely that the interviewer will ask you a variety of different questions, including some for both positive and negative experiences. There are some examples on what you should expect from an interview below.

Tell me about a time when you reached a goal at work?

Tell me about a time when you set a goal and didn't reach it?

Tell me about a time when you led a team? Did you have any problems? How did you solve them?

Tell me about a time when you struggled at work?

Tell me about a time when you had to solve a difficult problem?

If you are asked any of the above, even the ones asking about a time where something may not have gone exactly to plan, always finish on a positive note. If you are talking about a time when you didn't reach a goal, what did you do to ensure that next time you achieved it? If you are asked a question relating to a time where you worked as a team, ensure you are telling them how you worked in the team and the part you played in it. Yes, teamwork is important, but they want to know how you worked in that situation.

Start planning

The likelihood is, you won't be asked more than a couple of questions like this. So, there is no point getting flustered and worrying over not knowing what they will ask. The best advice I can give, is to think of both a positive and negative experience you had and adapt this scenario to the question you are asked. The most popular questions asked may include:

Tell me about a time when you were successful at work?

Tell me about a time when you struggled at work?

So, try and think of examples for these and practice them when you are doing your interview preparation. Behavioural questions are all about giving more than just one-word answers. They give the interviewer a more in-depth understanding on how you work, how you deal with problems in the workplace and who you are as a person. It allows them to understand your skills at a deeper level than just reading them off your CV. These questions can feel daunting, but once you get the hang of them, there is really nothing to worry about.

All students will be awarded with a Work Experience Certificate for participating in the day. This is something that they can include in their UCAS and Apprenticeship Applications. The next Work Experience day will cover the following healthcare careers:

- Nursing

- Dietetics
- Radiography
- Prosthetics and Orthotics

The virtual work experience day will take place through an online portal and run LIVE from 10am-5pm, following 2 patients from their initial accidents through to recovery. Students will see them interact with a variety of healthcare professionals listed above so that they develop an understanding of the multidisciplinary team as well as insights into their own chosen career.

Students will also have the opportunity to interact with the healthcare professionals via a LIVE Chat function and polls throughout the day!

The cost to attend is £10/student per session, which is just an administrative cost to cover the set-up of individual portals, personalised certificates, safeguarding, the technology on the day, such as our servers and chat functions.

Musician/ Recording Artist

Musicians create and/or perform music in a variety of genres, such as classical, rock, pop, indie, jazz or folk.

You could be a composer, instrumentalist and/or a singer performing either in the studio or to a live audience.

You may work alone, as a freelance artist, in collaboration with others, or as a salaried member of a:

- band
- choir
- theatrical ensemble
- opera company
- orchestra

Competition in this field is high, so you'll need to dedicate hours of practice to maintain and develop your skills whatever your preferred style.

Responsibilities

As there are many genres of music, some activities will differ depending on your area of expertise. However, you'll typically need to:

- perform at concerts, festivals, theatres and other music venues
- participate in recording sessions
- practise regularly
- attend rehearsals and plan performances
- prepare for auditions
- look after your instrument and/or voice
- set up/tune your instrument and other equipment, arranging for its transportation if required
- compose new songs and music
- promote your act by making demos, using social media, setting up your own website, and contacting agents and record companies
- handle the administration of business activities such as handling accounts, negotiating fees and organising distribution of your recordings both offline and online
- seek out new venues in which to perform
- arrange gigs and tours either yourself or through a manager or agent
