



Historical Fact of the Week On this day in 1929... ST. VALENTINE'S DAY MASSACRE Seven Gangsters Slain in Chicago

On 14th February 1929, seven members and associates of George "Bugs" Moran's bootlegging gang were lined up against a wall and shot dead inside a garage at 2122 North Clark Street on the north side of Chicago. Al Capone's Chicago Outfit was widely suspected of ordering the hit, but none of his gang was ever prosecuted.

The garage was the setting for the most horrific shooting in Mob history and when it was demolished in 1967 George Patey, an entrepreneur, recovered three hundred bricks from the bullet-ridden wall and sold them to the Mob Museum in Las Vegas.

The Bugs Moran's gang were lined up against a wall and shot down with Tommy guns. Some of their assailants were wearing police uniforms.

The Massacre was reported across the country. It horrified an American public that had previously viewed gangsters as heroic figures who robbed the government and the rich but provided liquor and luxuries for the less well off. A line had been crossed so that politicians and general public alike demanded a crackdown. The President, Herbert Hoover himself, called upon his federal law enforcement agencies to bring the culprits to justice.

Al Capone was immediately suspected of orchestrating the Massacre despite the fact that he was living in Florida at the time. Various suspects were arrested, including Capone's associate Jack McGurn, but the FBI couldn't build a strong enough case until the County coroner took a more scientific approach to investigating the Massacre. He brought in Dr. Calvin Goddard, a pioneer in the new field of ballistics. Goddard confirmed that two Tommy guns confiscated from Fred "Killer" Burke's house in rural Michigan were used in the shootings. Despite this, the Massacre has remained one of the greatest unsolved crimes in history.

Al Capone was long suspected of being the Massacre mastermind but there was no evidence to charge him. Instead, federal authorities eventually built a tax evasion case against him. He was convicted in 1931 and sentenced to 11 years in prison.


