

### Historical Story of the Week On this day in 1982. CRUISER 'GENERAL BELGRANO' TORPEDOED 323 Argentinians Killed in Falklands War

At 3:57pm on 2nd May 1982, the Royal Navy's nuclear submarine HMS *Conqueror* fired a spread of three torpedoes at the Argentine cruiser *General Belgrano*, sailing approximately 230 nautical miles south-west of the Falkland Islands. Two of the torpedoes found their marks on the port side of the vessel. In less than 30 minutes, the *Belgrano* sank, taking 323 souls with her.

The Belgrano's service career was rather uneventful until the outbreak of the Falklands War on 2nd April. Claiming the territory for itself, Argentina launched an invasion of the Falklands, as well as South Georgia and the South Sandwich Islands. Argentina's military junta assumed, incorrectly, that Britain would not attempt a military response. Many were surprised when the British sailed a hastily assembled task force of ships, aircraft, and ground troops 8,000 miles to the South Atlantic to retake the islands.


On 23rd April Britain imposed a 200-mile maritime exclusion zone around the Falklands, declaring that any ships within the zone could be attacked. A week later, the main body of the convoy had arrived off the islands. Argentina could threaten the British fleet with both its naval forces, including the aircraft carrier *Veinticinco de Mayo*, as well as fighter-bombers including *Super Étendards* armed with the, soon to be infamous, Exocet anti-ship missiles.

When British intelligence received word of the *General Belgrano's* movements, it was decided to attack. The sinking of *General Belgrano* was a shattering blow. Argentina withdrew its navy to their home ports and would instead rely on air attacks from its bases on the mainland. Britain would suffer its own losses, including two destroyers and two frigates, though none incurred the same loss of life as the *Belgrano*. To this day, HMS *Conqueror* remains the only nuclear submarine ever to sink an enemy ship.

On 25th April, South Georgia was retaken, and after several intensive naval battles fought around the Falklands, British troops landed on East Falkland on 21st May. After several weeks of fighting, the large Argentine garrison at Stanley surrendered on 14th June, effectively ending the conflict.






