Historical Story of the Week On this day in 1934 THE END OF BONNIE AND CLYDE Bank Robbers Killed in Hail of 100 Bullets

There are few couples who have made headlines in quite the same way as Bonnie Parker and Clyde Barrow. The couple are known for a series of bank robberies and murders that took place at the height of the Great Depression between 1932 and 1934. Over the years, their unseemly romance has been the inspiration for films, songs, and even a musical.

Bonnie Parker was born in Rowena, Texas in 1910. When her father died in 1914, her mother moved the family back to Dallas. Six days before her 16th birthday in 1926 she was married to Roy Thornton, her high school sweetheart. However, after Thornton was imprisoned in 1929 and the two never met again.

Clyde Barrow was born in 1909 in Texas. His family moved to Dallas in the early 1920s. They were extremely poor, and Barrow was first arrested for failing to return a rental car on time in 1926. With his older brother "Buck" (also, a future fellow gang member), he cracked safes, robbed stores, and stole cars throughout his youth.

Bonnie met Clyde met in 1930 at a friend's house in Dallas. Despite having just met, Bonnie visited Clyde frequently when he was jailed for stealing a car. She aided Clyde's escape by smuggling him a gun. Although Clyde was quickly recaptured, this certainly supported claims that they fell in love at first sight. Clyde was released on parole in 1932 after setting up an "accident" in which he lost two toes.

By the April of 1932, Bonnie became more involved with Clyde's criminal activities. They started robbing banks and grocery stores, taking hostages, and even murdering police officers. The gang included "Buck" (Clyde's older brother), Buck's wife Blanche, W. D. Jones, Henry Methvin, Raymond Hamilton, Joe Palmer, Ralph Fults, and S. J. Whatley. In one of their more successful robberies, the gang stole \$1,900, the equivalent of £32,000 today.

The couple spent the rest of their short lives running, and met their end on this day in 1934. Former Texas Ranger Frank Hamer discovered that they were en route to Bienville Parish, Louisiana. The police set up an ambush and the couple was shot to death in their car in a hail of 100 bullets.
