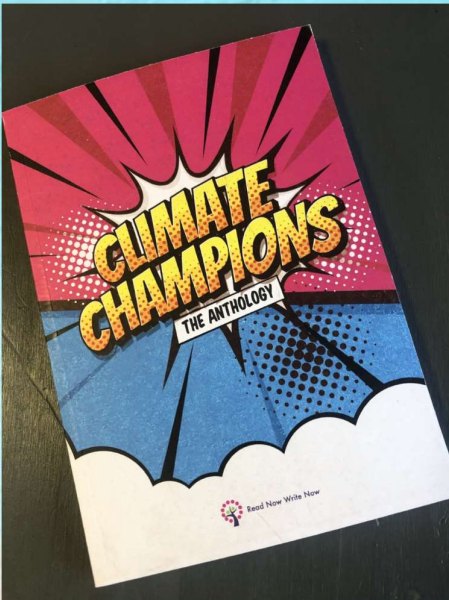

2A have been having a very busy week. They have become published authors!

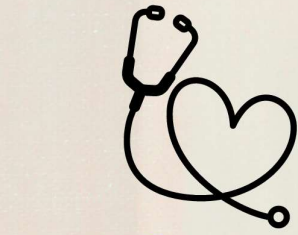

Today, 2A will receive their copies to keep forever so they can show everyone what a big achievement they have made and hopefully help people change their ways and help the environment.



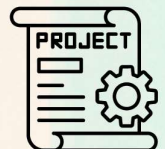
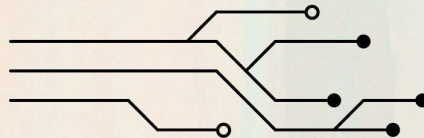
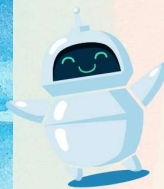

Ingredients

- 1 small onion, quartered
- small can (about 210g) red kidney beans, drained and rinsed
- 250g lean beef mince
- wholemeal breadcrumbs (from 1 slice of bread)
- 2 teaspoons mild chilli powder, or to taste
- 1 egg, beaten
- 1 tablespoon tomato purée



Method

1. Chop the onion in a food processor, then add the beans, mince, breadcrumbs, chilli powder, beaten egg and tomato purée, and mix again.

Information:

If you prefer a chunkier texture, mash the beans with a fork or potato masher, chop the onions by hand and then mix with the other ingredients.

2. Shape the mixture into 4 patties and chill until you're ready to cook.
3. Barbecue or grill for 5 to 7 minutes each side.
4. Serve in the rolls, with sliced onion and tomato, and lettuce leaves.

Information:

Serve with corn on the cob for a complete meal.
