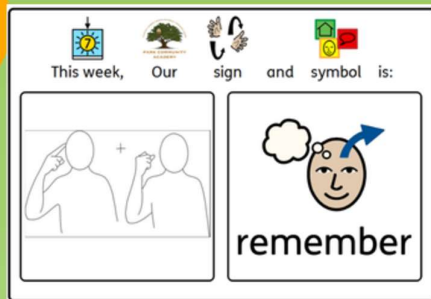

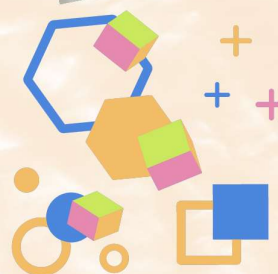


2E have had a great week back after half term.
