Monkey: free video chat app

The Monkey app is a live video and text-chat platform designed for connecting with strangers worldwide, similar to the defunct Omegle, but with a TikTok-style interface and features like video calls, user profiles, and "moments" (short video posts). While it includes safety features

like reporting and blocking, it lacks age verification, leading to concerns from online safety experts about the potential exposure to harmful content and interaction with underage devices and the web, having been removed from the Apple App Store due to safety issues.

Key features and functions:

Live Video Chat: Users can connect with random strangers from across the globe for one-on-one video calls.

with friends and other users.

Moments: Similar to TikTok or Instagram, users can post short video clips to their profile, which can be viewed by others.

Swipe to Match: Users can swipe on profiles to match with others, a feature borrowed from dating apps. HMU (Hit Me Up) Mode: Users can signal that they are available for a chat.



Key concerns and risks:

Lack of Age Verification: The app requires users to claim to be 18 or older but has no system for verifying this, increasing the risk of underage users being exposed to inappropriate content. Inappropriate Content: Online safety experts have documented significant amounts of disturbing, explicit, and harmful content, users. The app is primarily available on Android including pornography and inappropriate requests, despite user reporting features.

> Privacy Concerns: The app collects personal data IP addresses, and usage statistics without using end-to-end encryption, raising questions about the security of uploaded photos and videos.

Targeted at Teens: Despite the 18+ age Texting: Direct messaging is available to communicate requirement, the app's interface and features are marketed towards and popular with teens and young adults.

> Removal from Apple App Store: Apple removed the Monkey app from its app store due to safety concerns, though it remains available on Google Play and web browsers.

- 400g Spaghetti
- 175g Smoked pancetta, rind removed
- 2 tbsp extra virgin olive oil
 - 3 Garlic cloves
- 3 Large free-range eggs, beaten
- 50g Pecorino finely grated
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper

Method

- Bring 4.5 litres Water to the boil in a large saucepan with 8 teaspoons of salt.
 Add the spaghetti and cook for 9 minutes.
 - 3. Heat a large, deep frying pan over a medium-high heat, add the oil and the pancetta and fry until lightly golden.
- 4. Add the garlic and cook for a few seconds, then remove from the heat and set aside.
- 5. Drain the spaghetti well and tip into the frying pan with the pancetta and garlic.
 - 6. Add the beaten eggs and half of the cheese and toss together well.
 - 7. Season to taste with salt and pepper. The heat from the spaghetti will be sufficient to partly cook the egg, but still leave it moist and creamy.
- 8. Take to the table and serve in warmed pasta bowls, sprinkled with the rest of the cheese.



In our recent art lesson, the children explored the difference between abstract and realistic art through a vibrant volcano-themed project. We began by discussing the colours needed to represent different parts of a volcano, such as fiery reds and oranges for lava, and earthy tones for rock, helping the children understand how colour choices can reflect real-world elements.



We also discussed the shapes we see in volcanoes and what shapes we would need to paint to recreate the abstract art. Inspired by this, the class then created their own abstract paintings, using expressive brushstrokes and imaginative colour combinations to reinterpret volcano imagery in creative ways. The children showed fantastic engagement and creativity throughout, producing a wonderful variety of artwork that celebrated both observation and artistic freedom.
