Method

1. Add the mince and fry until browned.

- 2. Add the other ingredients and simmer until tender, about 45 minutes
- 3. Gently heat margarine, flour and milk together. Bring to the boil stirring ALL the time.
- 4. Remove from the heat and add most of the cheese, salt, pepper and mustard to taste. 5. Layer half the bolognese sauce, lasagne sheets the cheese sauce in the dish.
 - 6. Repeat
 - 7. Sprinkle with grated cheese.
 - 8. Place in oven for 20 minutes.


