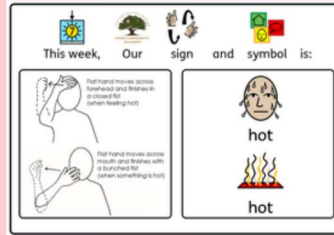

## KS1

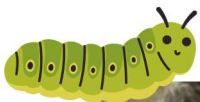

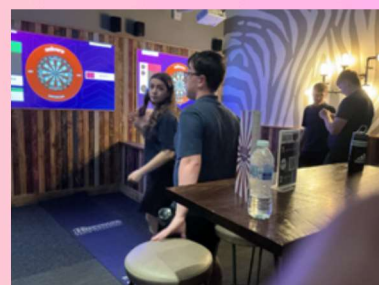

## NEW DIGITAL PATHWAY INFORMATION FOR SEND PARENTS & CARERS



Join us for a relaxed and friendly morning to find out more about a pilot taking place in Blackpool Teaching Hospitals' children's ADHD and Autism services.

**THINK DIVERGENT**

### BLACKPOOL ARE PILOTING A DIGITAL PATHWAY FOR CHILDREN'S ADHD & AUTISM REFERRALS WHERE:

- Schools and parents only need to provide information once
- Children's strengths and needs are identified
- The referral process will be more accessible, straightforward and transparent
- The technology is designed to be neuro-inclusive and is expected to save several hours per child triaged, improving the clinical team's productivity and reducing waiting times.

The session will involve a brief introduction of the pilot and an introduction to the technology.
