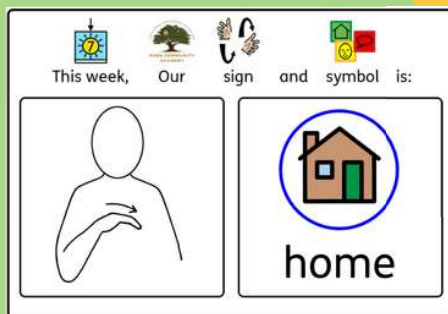

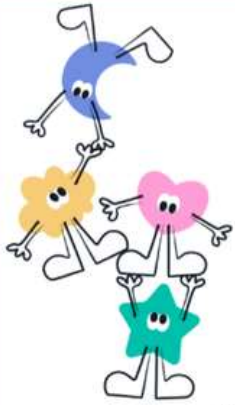
MEET DAISY & MOLLY!

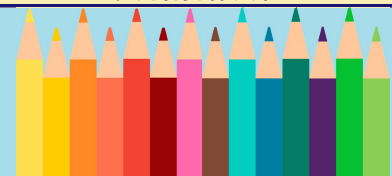

KS1

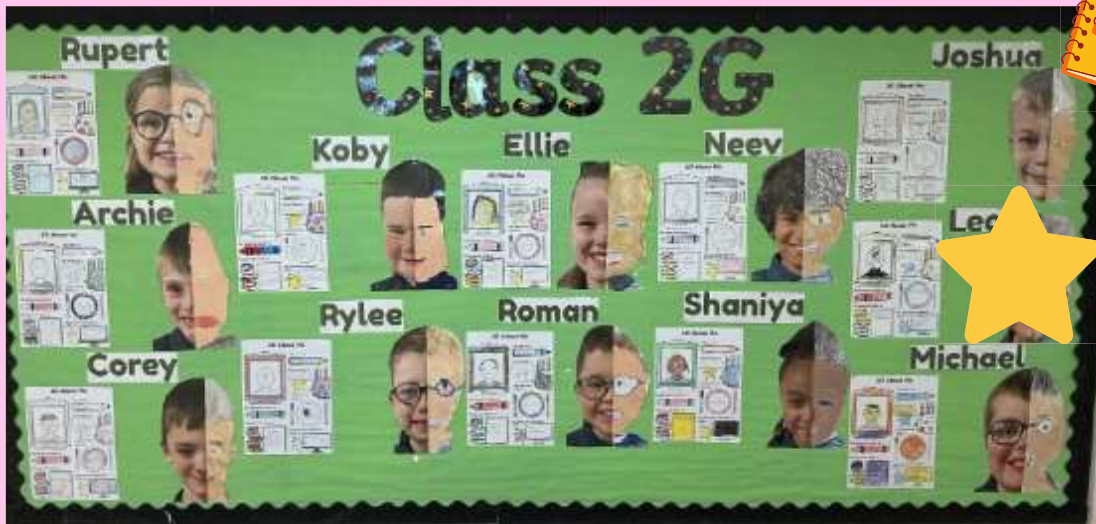

KS4

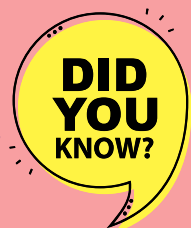

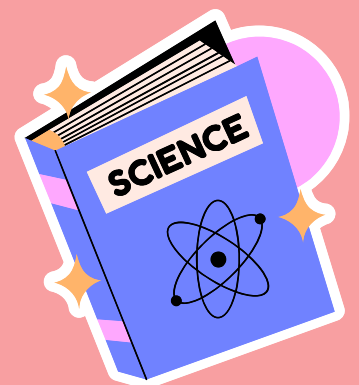
4W have been enjoying the start of their new Science unit all about the universe and learning about just how big space really is!



Did you know you can fit 1.3 million Earths inside the sun?

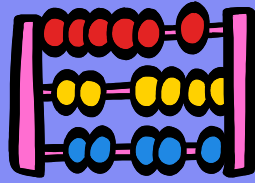

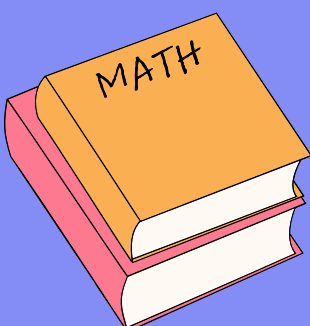
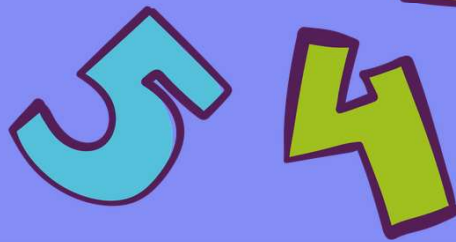


KS5
