MATHS

Number Place value: sorting & counting forwards and backwards Addition and subtraction: part whole methods, number bonds and related facts Geometry Investigating, sorting & identifying 2D and 3D shapes.

ENGLISH

Narrative: Stories with familiar settings, working towards creating a story setting. Non fiction: Instructions & writing a set of instructions. Poetry: Poems on a theme &

creating a poem. Regular phonics lessons based on Read, Write, Inc.

SCIENCE

In science we will be looking at animals in lots of different ways including different types of animals, how they move and communicate with each other, how we can group them, what their offspring look like, what their basic needs are and how to care for them.

HUMANITIES

In humanities this term we will be learning about The Stone Age through to The Bronze Age. This will include looking at the tools, food and the way children lived in each of the ages. Children will build up their historical vocabulary and look at some geographical settlements such as Skara Brae. They are also learning about archaeology and how we know about the past.

PHSE

Follow SCARF Units: Me and My Relationships and Valuing Difference.

MUSIC

This term in music, pupils are looking at the beginnings of formal notation, linking sounds to symbols and understanding that music has its own language. They will learn about music theory, copy back and improvise with rhythmic patterns and improvise using simple patterns that include basic rhythms. They will also develop their performance skills both in class and on the stage.

FRENCH

Where is France? Landmarks/ Geographical features, French Flag. Greetings, saying hello, goodbye and how are you? French Christmas

PE

Computing

Each class will follow the Multimedia: Text and Algorithms & Programming: Bee-Bots units from the PCA computing scheme of work.
