

ENGLISH

Narrative: Action and adventure working towards creating an adventure story.

Non fiction: Glossary (Alphabetically ordered texts) working towards writing a glossary. Poetry: Alliterative/ Alphabet list poems.

Regular phonics lessons based on Read, Write, Inc. Weekly SPAG lessons.

Handling and testing materials.

Understanding why different materials are used for different purposes.

Experimenting and designing products for a purpose e.g. waterproof.

COMPUTING

Each class will be working on Branching Databases during this half term. Children will be exploring different types of questions, yes/no answers and how to sort data according to a given criteria. In the second half term we will be looking at Multimedia, in particular we will be looking at digital painting and the works of famous artists. We will be choosing the correct tools to create a digital painting.

PE

Each class will follow their unit from the Lancashire PE scheme of work, with a Gymnastics focus on travelling, balance and flight, and developing Healthy Lifestyles through different physical activities.

HUMANITIES

Developing geographical skills such as map reading and finding information in atlases, learning how to use a compass and naming and locating all of earth's continents and oceans.

They will learn all about how Drama games help to develop skills which can be used in all areas of our lives. The skills will focus on: Communication, Confidence and Creativity. There will also be a link with Shakespeare.
