They concluded that our 'greatest success... Is the contribution to the Wild in the Art Elmer trail. ... this leaves a great legacy to build on!'



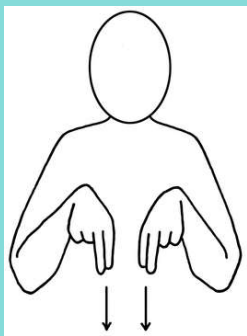
Congratulations

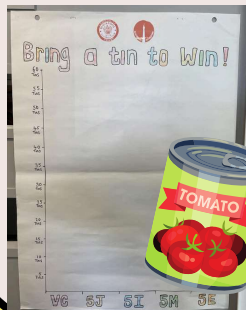
Sign of the Week
