KS5





The National Autistic Society has released a new e-learning module which is free to access throughout 2024.

The module is called

'A guide to the mental health experiences of autistic teenagers' and is aimed at professionals, parents and carers who are supporting autistic young people aged 13 years old and above.

The module has three parts, covering:

- Understanding autistic identity
- Understanding the mental health experiences of autistic teenagers
