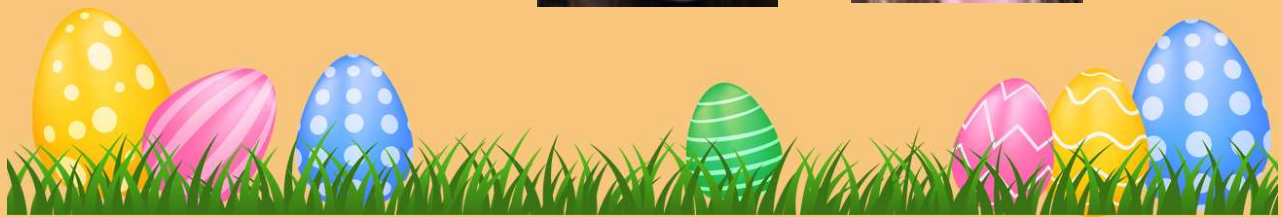

The Trust will work with the DfE and Blackpool Council in securing a site for both schools and agreeing an opening date, which is not likely to be until September 2026.
