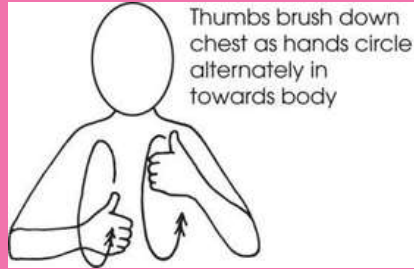

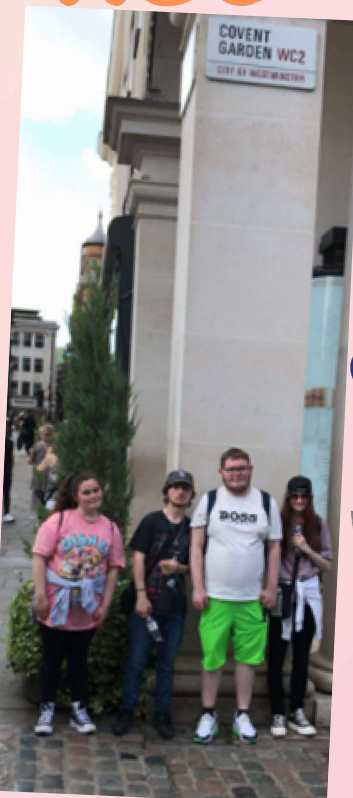
PIC-COLLAGE
