




School Nurse

HEADLICE AND NITS



Head lice eggs (nits)
are brown or white
(empty shells) and
attached to the hair.

How to get rid of head lice

Treat head lice as soon as you spot them. You should check everyone in the house and start treating anyone who has head lice on the same day.

You can treat head lice without seeing a GP.

Medicated lotion or sprays can be brought from
pharmacies, supermarkets or online. These kill head
lice in all types of hair.

Wet combing is another way to get rid of lice and nits.

You can buy a special fine-toothed comb (detection comb) online or from pharmacies to remove head lice and nits.

There may be instructions on the pack, but usually you:

Wash hair with ordinary shampoo apply lots of conditioner (any conditioner will do), comb the whole head of hair, from the roots to the ends.

Do wet combing on days 1, 5, 9 and 13 to catch any newly hatched head lice. Check again that everyone's hair is free of lice on day 17.

There's no need to keep your child off school if they have head lice.



Head lice are small insects, up to 3mm long.



They can be difficult to spot in your hair.

In 1H we love reading books. Every week we go to the library and choose new stories to enjoy in our classroom. This week it has been lovely to see all the children choosing to read stories.










