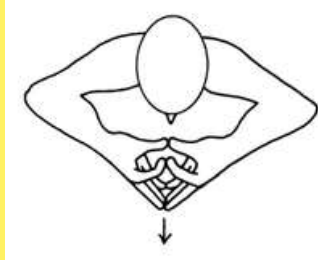
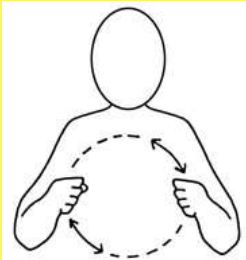
**Congratulations** to classes 2M, 3T, and 4W for 100% attendance this week. Whole school attendance is 93.6%

## ASDA Rewards Cashpot for Schools

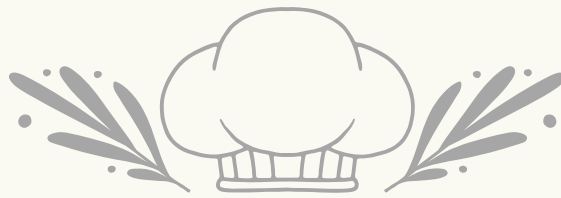

### Challenge Details:

- 1. Choose Your Recipe:** Select any bread recipe you like! Here are some ideas to inspire you:
  - o Classic White Bread

  - o Focaccia
  - o Cinnamon Rolls
  - o Breadsticks
- 2. Get Baking:** Use your sachet of yeast to start your bread-making journey. Feel free to experiment with flavors, add-ins, and shapes!
- 3. Document Your Process:** Take photos or videos of your bread-making process. Capture moments like mixing, kneading, rising, and baking!
- 4. Final Product:** Once your bread is baked, take a beautiful picture of the final product.
- 5. Submission:** Submit your best photo along with a brief description of your recipe and any unique twists you added an email [admin@park.svt.org.uk](mailto:admin@park.svt.org.uk)
- 6. Judging Criteria:** Entries will be judged on:
  - o Creativity (originality of the recipe or presentation)
  - o Visual Appeal (how the bread looks in the photo)
  - o Taste (if possible, share feedback from family or friends!)
- 7. Prizes:** Exciting prizes will be awarded to the top three entries, including:
  - o Baking tools
  - o Recipe books



### Tips for Success:

- Follow the recipe closely, especially the yeast activation process.
  - Don't rush the rising time; patience is key!
  - Have fun and don't be afraid to experiment!

This week we have been building catapults, making sock puppets and even writing space fact files!

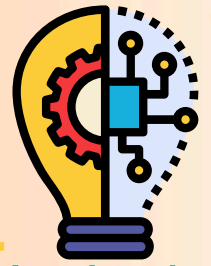


# KS3
