Sensory Chew Toys

Many of our pupils use sensory chew toys in school and at home. Here are some helpful tips to make sure they are safe for your child.

- Be sure you have purchased a chewy from a reputable company that tests products for compliance with all applicable safety standards, including phthalates and BPA. Not all chewies are made the same. When tubing is part of the chewy, medical grade tubing is best. Chewbuddy's are CE marked and made from medical grade material.
- It is wise to inspect the chewy regularly for wear and tear. If cracks or weaknesses are noted, discard and replace the chewy.
- A chewy necklace should be large enough to be easily removed or have a quick release or breakaway clasp that pops open easily. Please note we can not let a child use them in school unless they have the quick release or breakaway clasp on them.
- Chewies should be washed with antibacterial soap and water after each use and left to air dry. Some chewies (such as the Chewbuddy) are dishwasher safe on the top rack – check the care instructions.




Classroom News

Wonderful work 1H!

















For the first week back in 2C it has been all about friendship and snow!


KS3
