<p>Literacy</p> <p>Share the story 'Rumble in the Jungle' by Giles Andreae with someone at home. https://www.booktrust.org.uk/books-and-reading/have-some-fun/storybooks-and-games/rumble-in-the-jungle/</p> <p>Write/ copy / over copy the names of your favourite jungle animals from the story. Have a go at identifying the initial sound in the word e.g. the initial sound you can hear in 'snake' is 's'.</p> <p>Play animal bingo on phonics play. www.phonicsplay.co.uk/AnimalBingo</p>	<p>Understanding the World</p> <p>Search for jungle animals photos online using a child safe search engine https://www.kiddle.co/</p> <p>Make your own jungle den in the house or garden.</p> <p>Have a go at drawing a monkey, a tiger, a snake. Can you think of some other animals that live in the jungle? What noises do the animals make?</p>
<p>Maths</p> <p>Number Hunt - Ask someone at home to hide some cut-out numbers around the house and see if you can find them –shout out the number when you find it. Then put them in order to make a number line. Switch it around! You have a go at writing/copying/over copying numbers and hide them around your house.</p> <p>Name and order the numbers in the caterpillar game. https://www.topmarks.co.uk/ordering-and-sequencing/caterpillar-ordering</p> <p>Meet the numbers from the numberblocks on the Cbeebies website. Play the number blocks 'make and play' game. https://www.bbc.co.uk/cbeebies/shows/numberblocks</p>	<p>Physical Development</p> <p>Create your own actions to pretend to be the different jungle animals described in the story 'Rumble in the Jungle'.</p> <p>Yoga Time! Jungle Themed Safari. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=C4CaR0syf1g</p> <p>Play the game - what time is it Mr Lion? This game has the same premise as 'What time is it Mr Wolf?' We play this game lots in school. Can you tell someone at home how to play?</p> <p>Use the recipe on the 1B class blog to make play doh. Make jungle animals using your play doh.</p>
<p>Expressive Arts and Design</p> <p>Make your own Jungle picture online. https://www.booktrust.org.uk/books-and-reading/have-some-fun/storybooks-and-games/jungle-picture-maker/</p> <p>Cut out the shape of a snake from paper or cardboard. Colour patterns on your snake or use materials and glue to make a collage to decorate your jungle snake.</p> <p>Make an animal a home using different materials - LEGO, sticks and leaves, pasta, building blocks. https://www.thenational.academy/reception/foundation/construction-reception-wk1-4</p>	<p>Personal, Social and Emotional Development</p> <p>Handwashing. Have a go with helping to make a snack at home. Follow the instructions from an adult. You could spread your own butter and jam on your toast. You could cut up your fruit using a knife.</p>
