Literacy


Create your own dinosaur. Draw a picture and then write its name underneath. Ask an adult to help you write some describing words about your new dinosaur. Is it scary? Is it friendly? Is it large, long or scaly?

Have a look at some pictures of dinosaurs on the computer or use a book you might have at home. Think of a dinosaur from your selection of pictures and describe it to someone at home. They have to guess which dinosaur you are! Remember to use describing words to describe the dinosaur. E.g. I am big and have a long neck. I like to eat the leaves in the trees.

The word dinosaur begins with the sound 'd'. Can you think of other words that begin with the same sound? Do the same for the different types of dinosaurs velociraptor, T-Rex and so on.

Read the story 'Toot goes to dinosaurland'. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=o2h8hqP_i-8

Talk about the story with someone at home. Think about which dinosaur you like the best. Would you like to go to dinosaurland? Make your own adventure car using cardboard boxes and other junk you might have at home. Role play the story. Talk about what you might see in dinosaurland. Draw a picture of what you have seen on your pretend adventure and label the picture.



Maths

If you have toy dinosaurs at home - order them by size. Which dinosaur is the biggest? Which is the smallest?





Understanding the World

<u>Dinosaur Skeletons - Experts</u> have learned a lot about dinosaurs by studying their bones. Now it's your turn. Ask a grown up to get some pasta and create your own dinosaur skeleton by gluing it to some paper. Have a good



think about all the different parts of the dinosaur and make sure the bones are in all the right places. If you don't have pasta, cotton buds work very well too!

<u>Habitat</u> - Do you have any little dinosaur figures at home? If not, you can create some using paper and pens or play dough. Next ask a grown up for a jar or a box and build your own dinosaur habitat. A habitat is where a creature lives and can get all the food, drink and safety it needs to survive. So have a think what a dinosaur needs. Does the dinosaur eat leaves or meat? Is there water to get a drink and a shelter to sleep in?

<u>Diet -</u> It is important to eat the right things, and dinosaurs would walk for miles to make sure they ate the correct leaves or berries. Eating healthy is important for us too so make sure you eat lots of fruit and vegetables so your body stays healthy. You could make a fruit salad or fruit kebab. Have a go at home.

Have a go at making your own dinosaur fossils. First you need to make your own salt dough following the recipe below. Before placing in the oven push a dinosaur into the dough to create the fossil.

Once out of the oven and



cooled down why not paint them!

- Mix two cups of flour and one cup of salt together in a bowl. Slowly mix one cup of water, a few tablespoons at a time, into flour mixture until dough is smooth and easy to handle. Knead dough for 10 minutes and let rest for 20 minutes.
- Form dough into desired shapes and arrange on a baking sheet.
- Bake in the preheated oven until dry and hard, about 2 hours. Allow to cool completely.
