### Literacy

Read along with the story 'There's a hole at the bottom of the sea'.

Look at the different sea creatures in the story. Think of words to describe them? What colour are they? Are they spotty or stripy? Ask an adult to help you write down your ideas. Draw some simple fish shapes. Decorate the fish using different patterns and colours. Ask an adult to decorate a fish as well. Take it in turns to describe each other's fish.



Miss Barlow has decorated a fish. I described my fish as "spotty" "green" and "happy".

Read the names of the sea creatures and match them to the picture in this fun game on Espresso.

Write/ copy/ overcopy the alphabet. Use the abc song to help you or use some of the songs we listen to in school.

Then go on a hunt around your house to find items beginning with the different sounds.



### Maths

Draw some circles and write numbers in the middle. See if you can count out the correct amount of objects on the circles. You could use LEGO bricks, pasta, cars etc.

If you have building bricks at home, you could make towers using the right number of bricks in the circles.



Extra challenge – if you add '1 more' to the number of objects, how many? If you take '1 away' from the number of objects, how many?

In 1B we love being active in maths. The following game is one of our favourites. You need dice or home made numbers cards (numbers written on strips of paper) and strips of paper with different actions written on e.g. clapping, jumping. Take it in turns to roll the dice or to find a number and then pick an action card. Do the action that amount of times. Make sure to count out loud!

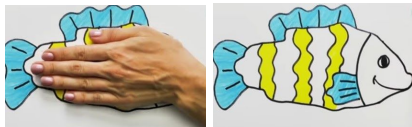

## Expressive Arts and Design

Draw your own sea creatures.

Start by drawing round your hand (you may need help with this bit) then you can use lots of colors and patterns to design some really funky fish!



Create your very own shiny fishes using some tin foil then decorate them with colours to make them really interesting! Or make a turtle using a paper plate and stick some shapes on to decorate its shell.
