

Ask an adult to write the names first and then you can copy if you need help.</p> <p>Write instructions to make a healthy smoothie out of fruit! Name the fruits you are going to use, then decide whether you are going to; squeeze, chop, drop the fruit in. Which order will you put them into the blender in? If you write the instructions your teacher can have a go at making it too!</p> <p>Have a go at the phonics activities on phonics bloom. All start from the same starting point then one at a time jump. Leave a mark to show where they jumped to. Then work out who could jump the furthest.</p> <p>Choose a non-standard measure tool to measure items around your garden and house. For example you could use cubes - how many cubes long is the table? How many cubes long is the leaf? You could also try using a ruler and explore measuring items around your garden and house.</p>

## Expressive Arts and Design



**Make your own bird** - birds come in all shapes, sizes and wonderful colours. Using some cardboard, colours and glue see if you can create your very own bird.

**Design your own feathers** - have you ever thought of using things like pasta, forks or a hairbrush to paint with? These items make interesting textures in paint and could help you to design your own bird feathers.



**Create a nest** - Go on a nature hunt in your garden or the park and gather some twigs, leaves and feathers. Then, using play dough, make a nest shape and stick your goodies inside to make it look really interesting. (There are plenty of play dough recipes on YouTube and the class blog)

## Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Make your own edible bird's nest - ask an adult to help you melt some chocolate before mixing it into shredded wheat. Scoop the mixture into cake cases and leave to set in the fridge, you could even add some chocolate eggs on the top!
