<p style="text-align: center;">Literacy</p> <p>Enjoy reading the story 'Sharing a Shell' with someone at home. Stop the story at various points and name the characters and sea creatures that you can see. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=VpJumAZx1t8</p> <p>Create some puppets of the crab, anemone and bristleworm. Could you use these to perform the story to an audience?</p> <p>Create your own illustrations of the creatures / places mentioned in the story.</p> <p>Explore the story 'Steven the Seagull' through this interactive game. Listen to the sounds that he finds at the seaside. Steven writes a postcard from his holiday at the seaside. Ask an adult to pour a material into a tray for use to practice. See the picture for an example.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Maths</p> <p>Practice naming and drawing shapes to create a face. What other pictures can you make from different 2D shapes?</p> <p>Can you make repeating patterns? For a challenge have a go at this game:</p> <p>https://www.topmarks.co.uk/ordering-and-sequencing/sape-patterns</p> <p>Are you feeling hungry? There are lots of recipes on Cbeebies. Have a go at following the recipes in sequence. Practice counting or measuring the ingredients https://www.bbc.co.uk/cbeebies/curation/cbeebies-house-recipes</p> <p>Can you count the correct number of eggs for the brownie mixture? How many vegetables will you put on the pizza?</p> <p>Practise writing your numbers too! https://www.bbc.co.uk/cbeebies/watch/playlist-number-raps</p> <p>Sing along with these number songs and practice clapping for the correct number of times. If you want to challenge yourself use; sweets, fruit or finger painting to practise splitting numbers in two. Count out two groups and then find out how many altogether!</p>

Expressive Arts and Design

Design a shell - Find your pens, pencils, paints and glue and get creative making your own crab shells. If you have paper plates at home, they work great too. Once you have finished making different shells draw a crab on a



piece of paper and put all the different shells on it to see which is your favourite!

You can draw round your hands too to make a crab.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Feeling safe - In the story 'Sharing a Shell' the crab doesn't feel safe without a shell. Why don't you try building a little den to share with your toys and feel how safe and cosy you feel. Maybe read them a story while you are in there.



Sharing is good - Sharing can be tricky and not always easy. Have a think about all the things you share and how it makes you feel. What do you like sharing?

Can you practice sharing things out at home to make it fair. You could host a tea party with all your toys and teddies. Make sure everyone has a fair amount of biscuits!
